



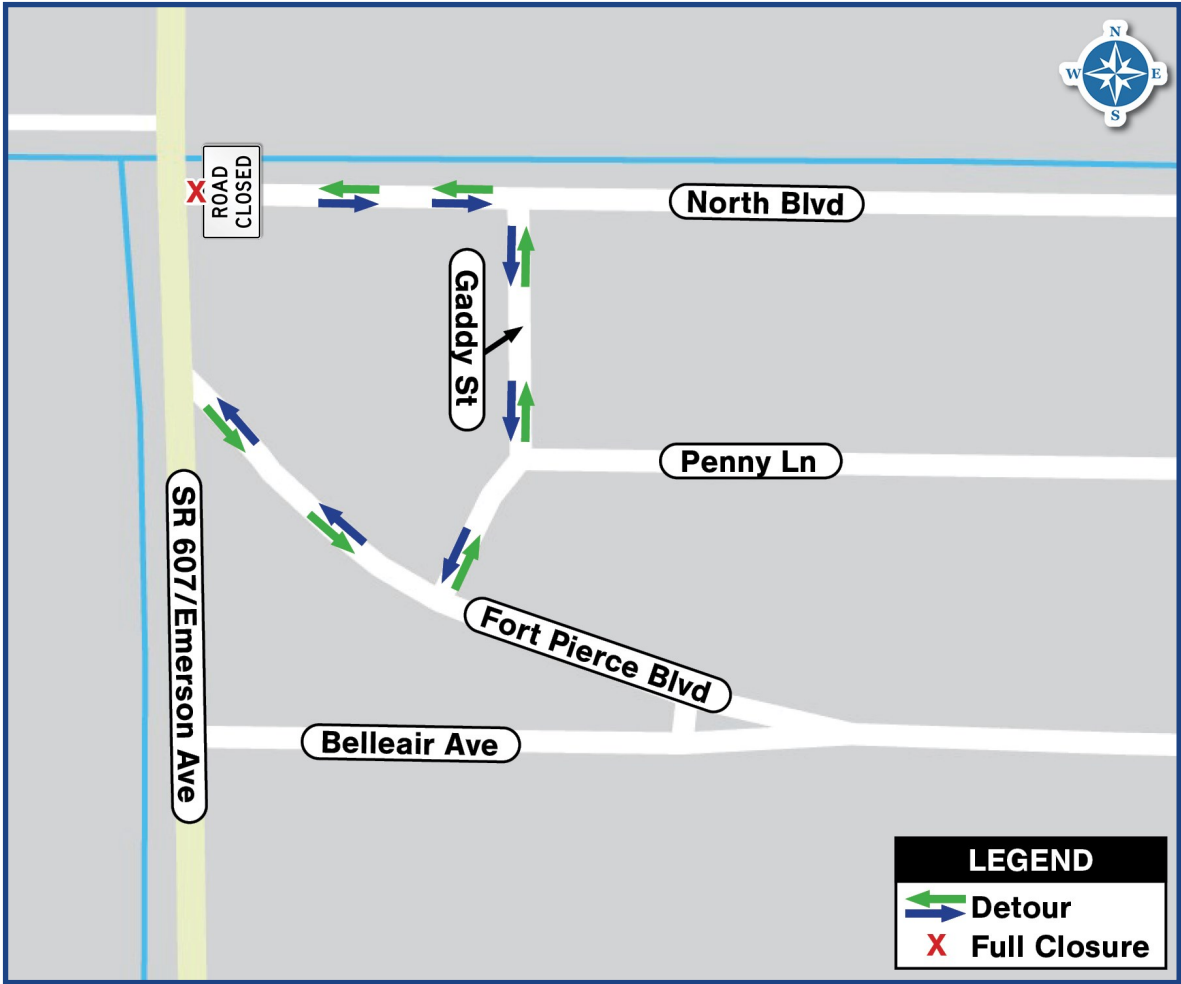

TRAFFIC DETOUR OF NORTH BOULEVARD AT SR 607/EMERSON AVENUE EXTENDED THROUGH MAY 30

To ensure community and crew safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, North Boulevard at SR 607/Emerson Avenue will be intermittently closed between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Friday, May 30, for drainage work. This closure was first implemented on April 23. Signage will be posted to assist motorists. The closure may be extended through Friday, June 6, due to weather conditions or unforeseen impacts.

- **Southbound** SR 607/Emerson Avenue to eastbound North Boulevard motorists will be detoured via southbound SR 607/Emerson Avenue to eastbound on Fort Pierce Boulevard to northbound on Gaddy Street to North Boulevard.
- **Northbound** SR 607/Emerson Avenue to North Boulevard motorists will be detoured via eastbound Fort Pierce Boulevard to northbound on Gaddy Street to North Boulevard.
- **Westbound** North Boulevard to SR 607/Emerson Avenue motorists will be detoured via southbound on Gaddy Street to westbound Fort Pierce Boulevard to SR 607/Emerson Avenue.
- Access to local residences on North Boulevard will be maintained.
