SR 656/17th Street East End of Bridge Rehabilitation and Improvements Project

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a Virtual Public Meeting and In-person Construction Open House regarding upcoming improvements to the east end of the SR 656/17th Street bridge and SR 656/17th Street in the City of Vero Beach. Please see below for detailed meeting information.

Construction Cost: \$22.3 million

Construction Start: May 2023

Estimated Completion: Summer 2028

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Replacement of the eastern 400 feet of the existing bridge.
- Sealing the full length of the existing bridge deck surface.
- Upgrading signing and pavement markings.

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- During Phase 1 of construction, the north side of the SR 656/17th Street bridge will be closed to traffic. One lane of traffic will be open in each direction on the south side of the bridge.
- During Phase 2 of construction, the south side of the SR 656/17th Street bridge will be closed to traffic. One lane of traffic will be open in each direction on the north side of the bridge.
- During portions of Phases 1 and 2 of construction, the SR 656/17th Street bridge will be periodically closed to traffic to facilitate bridge construction. Detours are as follows:
 - Westbound motorists will be detoured via SR A1A and SR 60/Beachland Boulevard to Indian River Boulevard.
 - Eastbound motorists will be detoured via Indian River Boulevard and SR-60/Beachland Boulevard to SR A1A.
- During Phase 3 of construction, single-lane closures are permitted at night, Sunday through Thursday from 9:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.
- The regulatory speed limit will be reduced from 45 miles per hour to 35 miles per hour for the duration of construction.
- Business and residential access will be maintained at all times.


