
17th Street/Alma Lee Loy Bridge Work From Indian River Boulevard to State Road (SR) A1A

17th Street Bridge Update

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Four, is pleased to provide an update on the 17th Street Bridge work in Indian River County. The completion date for this project has been revised to Spring 2022, weather permitting. Repairs to the westbound portion of the bridge have been finalized, and the project is preparing to shift both eastbound and westbound traffic to the westbound portion of the bridge during the week of September 7th, 2021 (after Labor Day). Once traffic is shifted to the westbound portion of the bridge, the eastbound repairs will begin.

This work is part of the third phase of construction on the 17th Street Bridge where spall repairs of concrete beams on the east end of the bridge are occurring at spans 58 and 59 of the 62-span bridge. The first phase was repair of the bridge bullet railing and fender system which was completed in April 2020. The second phase was the replacement of the lighting system, and it was completed in December 2020.
