



# FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION INVITES YOU TO A PUBLIC MEETING

**I-95 RESURFACING, RESTORATION, AND REHABILITATION (RRR) PROJECTS**  
State Road (SR) 9/I-95 from north of Bridge Road to south of Kanner Highway and  
SR 9/I-95 from south of Kanner Highway to Martin/St. Lucie County Line  
Martin County, Florida

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will conduct a public meeting for the above referenced projects within Martin County. This public meeting will be offered in-person and virtually simultaneously. The public meeting will have representatives available to answer questions. Project information will be available for public viewing. Questions and comments may be submitted prior to the meeting by contacting the Project Manager. **PURPOSE OF PROJECT:** This project aims to enhance resiliency and safety along SR 9/I-95 from north of Bridge Road to the Martin/St. Lucie County line. Key improvements include repaving, restriping, and widening the northbound on-ramp shoulder, along with measures to reduce wet weather crashes, enhance nighttime visibility, and prevent wrong way driving, all in line with FDOT's commitment to creating a resilient and secure transportation network.

## PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

- Repave and restripe the existing roadway from north of Bridge Road to the Martin/St. Lucie County line to rehabilitate the pavement.
- Widen the northbound on-ramp shoulder from SR 76/Kanner Highway to meet current standards.
- Improve roadway slopes in hydroplaning risk areas to reduce wet weather crashes.
- Upgrade signing and pavement markings north of Bridge Road to the Martin/St. Lucie County line as required to meet current standards.
- Conventional lighting will be constructed to help reduce nighttime crashes.
- Install wrong way detection system on Kanner Highway and Martin Highway ramps to reduce the potential for wrong way crashes.

## CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS

- Detours will be required to complete milling and resurfacing of the interchange ramps.
  - Nighttime closures will take place during the weekdays from 8 PM to 6 AM
- Work will be done in phases to reduce the effects of construction on the community.

## CONSTRUCTION INFORMATION

- Anticipated Construction Start: **Spring 2025**
- Anticipated Construction End: **Winter 2026**
- Estimated Construction Cost: **\$48.4 Million**

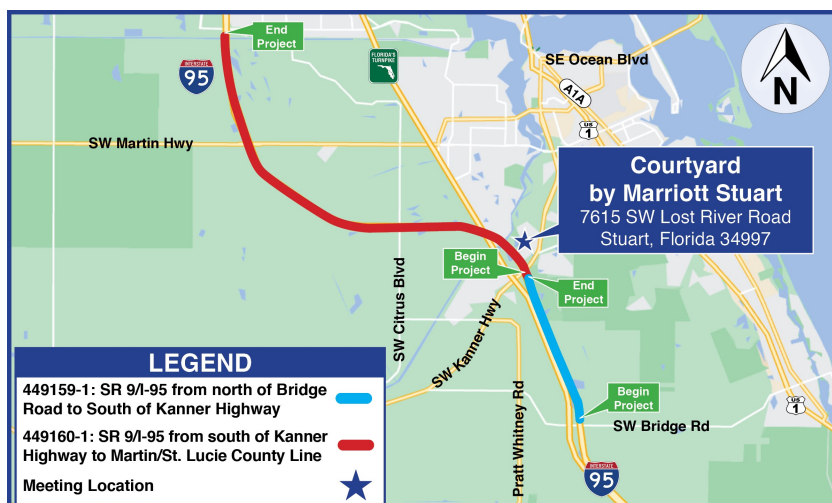
