


FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TRAFFIC DETOURS FOR ROADWAY RECONSTRUCTION

SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard Widening Project

South of SW Alcantarra Boulevard to South of SW Darwin Boulevard in the City of Port St. Lucie, FL





Full Closure of S Globe Avenue at SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard through December 6, 2024

The City of Port St. Lucie, as Project Sponsor, requested that the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) design and construct the SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard Widening Project, through application to the St. Lucie Transportation Planning Organization and City of Port St. Lucie Resolution 18-R42. This project aims to enhance the safety, resiliency, and longevity of the infrastructure within our communities. Please see below for more information on detours required for roadway reconstruction.

Construction Cost: \$11,570,179 Construction Start: January 27, 2022 Anticipated Completion: Early 2025

S GLOBE AVENUE AT SW PORT ST. LUCIE BOULEVARD CLOSED FOR ROADWAY RECONSTRUCTION

- Beginning at 8 a.m., Thursday, October 3, 2024, S Globe
 Avenue at SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard will be closed
 around-the-clock through 5 p.m., Friday, December 6,
 2024, for roadway reconstruction. Saturday, Dec. 7
 through Friday, Dec. 13, will be used as contingency dates
 if needed.
- SW Port St. Lucie motorists heading south to S Globe Avenue will be detoured via SW N Globe Avenue to S Globe Avenue
- SW Port St. Lucie motorists heading north to S Globe Avenue will be detoured via SW Alcantarra Boulevard, and north on SW Vendome Street to S Globe Avenue.

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Widen SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard from a two-lane undivided roadway to a four-lane divided roadway
- Install three (3) new signalized intersections with mast arms at SW Alcantarra Boulevard, SW Tulip Boulevard, and SW Tunis Boulevard
- Add a right turn lane on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard's north approach to SW Alcantarra Boulevard
- Construct an 18-foot wide raised median with curb and gutter
- Upgrade crosswalks and curb ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards
- Construct 8 to 10-foot wide sidewalks on both sides of SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard for pedestrian and bicycle use, and 6-foot wide sidewalks on side streets
- Install new closed drainage system, pond, signing, pavement markings, signalization, and lighting upgrades
- Add landscaping to median, install irrigation, and stamped concrete
