SB TURNPIKE CLOSURE FROM BECKER RD TO SR 714/MARTIN HWY

State Road (SR) 714/Martin Highway Improvements Project

Southbound Turnpike at Becker Road to Undergo Full Closure, Thursday, Nov. 7 & Monday, Nov. 11

Southbound Florida’s Turnpike between Becker Road (Exit 138) in St. Lucie County and SR 714/Martin Highway (Exit 133) in Martin County, may be closed to traffic overnight, 10:30 p.m. until 5:30 a.m., Thursday night, Nov. 7, Monday night, Nov. 11, for paving. Tuesday night, Nov. 12, will be used as a contingency date if needed. Advanced notice and detour signage will be in place to assist motorists.

SOUTHBOUND TURNPIKE ENTRANCE RAMP DETOUR:

The southbound Florida’s Turnpike entrance ramp from Becker Road will also be closed during this operation. Westbound Becker Road traffic will be detoured via the I-95 southbound entrance ramp to SR 706/Indiantown Road. Motorists can re-enter the Florida’s Turnpike Highway System via SR 706/Indiantown Road west.

The southbound Florida’s Turnpike entrance ramp from SR 714/Martin Highway will not be impacted and will remain accessible during this operation.

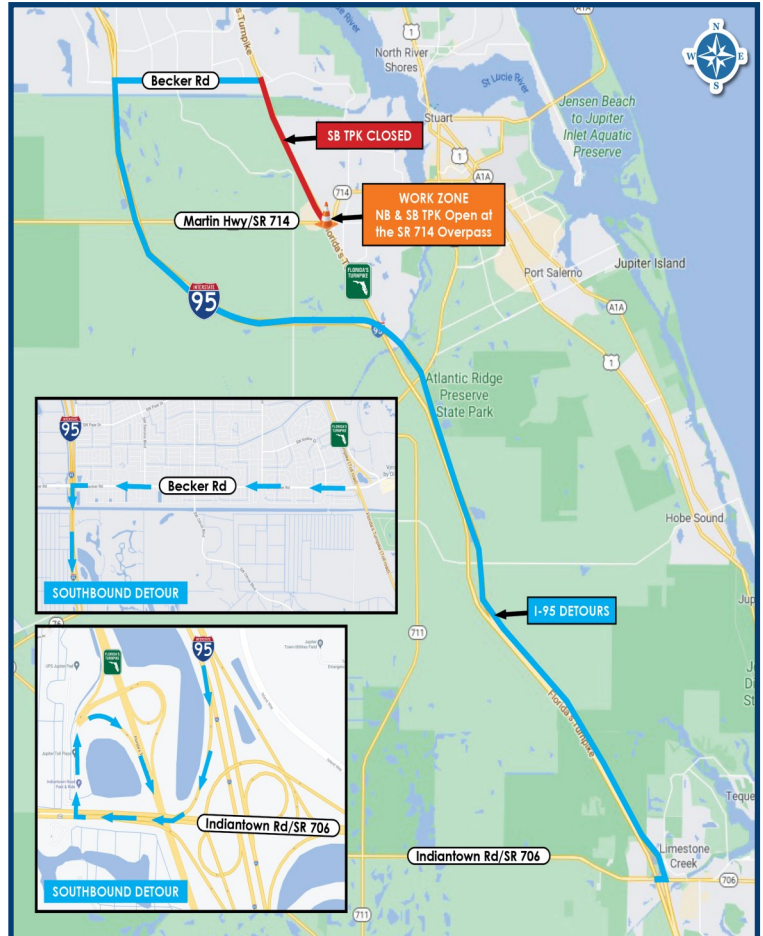
This work is part of the SR 714/SW Martin Highway widening project. Project improvements include widening SR 714/SW Martin Highway to a four-lane divided urban roadway, widening the bridge over Florida’s Turnpike, constructing seven-foot buffered bike lanes and six-foot sidewalks on both sides of the roadway, and installing signing, signalization, and lighting upgrades.
