SR 607/Emerson Avenue Resurfacing Project

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) invites the community to a Virtual Public Meeting and In-Person Construction Open House regarding the upcoming SR 607/Emerson Avenue Resurfacing Project in St. Lucie County. The project limits are on SR 607/Emerson Avenue from north of SR 614/Indrio Road to south of 25th Street SW. This project aims to enhance the safety, resiliency, and longevity of the infrastructure within our communities. Please see below for detailed meeting information.

Construction Cost: \$6.4 Million

Construction Start: January 2025

Estimated Completion: Spring 2026

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Milling and resurfacing the travel lanes to enhance safety and long-term resiliency
- Widening the existing 5-foot paved shoulder to 7-feet to enhance safety
- Constructing a sidewalk (varying from 6 to 12 feet in width) along the east side of SR 607/Emerson Avenue from Hibiscus Road to North Road to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians
- Upgrading curb ramps along existing sidewalks to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians
- Installing concrete pads at two existing bus stops along northbound SR 607/Emerson Avenue, located approximately 300 feet south of Hibiscus Road and approximately 100 feet north of Belleair Avenue, to enhance safety, functionality, and long-term resiliency
- Upgrading signage and pavement markings to improve safety, functionality, and traffic operations

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Single-lane closures on SR 607/Emerson Avenue are permitted as follows:
 - Daytime, Monday through Sunday, from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
 - Nighttime, Monday through Sunday, from 8:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. for milling, resurfacing, and striping work
- The speed limit on SR 607/Emerson Avenue between SR 614/Indrio Road and Hibiscus Road will be reduced from 50 MPH to 45 MPH during construction
- The speed limit on SR 607/Emerson Avenue between Hibiscus Road and Deland Avenue will be reduced from 50 MPH to 40 MPH during construction
- The speed limit on SR 607/Emerson Avenue between Deland Avenue and 25th Street SW will be reduced from 50 MPH to 45 MPH during construction
- Residential and business access will be maintained
