SR 656/17th Street Bridge to Undergo Full Closure for Traffic Shift Operations, Dec. 9-13, 2024

The SR 656/17th Street Bridge between SR A1A and Indian River Boulevard will be **closed from 12:01 a.m., Monday, Dec. 9, 2024, through approximately 5:00 a.m., Friday, Dec. 13, 2024**, to shift traffic to the north side of the bridge. The traffic shift will require a week due to utility relocations on both sides of the bridge, the harmonization of traffic transitions, and the complete demobilization and relocation of equipment and materials. Monday, Dec. 16 through Friday, Dec. 20 will be used as contingency dates if needed.

- Westbound motorists will be detoured via SR A1A and SR 60/Beachland Boulevard to SR 60/Indian River Boulevard.
- Eastbound motorists will be detoured via SR 60/Indian River Boulevard and SR 60/Beachland Boulevard to SR A1A.
- Only local traffic will be allowed on the east side of the bridge.
- Once the traffic shift is completed, one eastbound and westbound lane will be open in each direction on the north side of the bridge.
