Project Limits



Project Overview

Purpose: The project aims to enhance safety, traffic operations, and long-term resiliency within the project limits through roadway resurfacing, intersection and signal upgrades, pedestrian and bicycle improvements, lighting enhancements, drainage upgrades, and improved signage and pavement markings.

Length:

- SR 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard – 1.6 miles
- SR 5/US 1 – 0.7 miles

Contractor: Ranger Construction Industries, Inc.

Construction Start: August 2025

Cost: \$6.8 Million

Estimated Completion: Spring 2027

Scope of Work

Roadway Improvements

Roadway Improvements

- Milling and repaving the existing roadways within the project limits to enhance safety and long-term resiliency.
- Upgrading signalization at the intersections of Lennard Road, SR 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard, SE Morningside Boulevard, and SE Gowin Drive to improve traffic operations.
- Modifying the lane configuration on Lennard Road at SR 5/US 1 to enhance safety and traffic operations.

Scope of Work

Roadway and Drainage Improvements

Roadway Improvements (Cont.)

- Upgrading signage and pavement markings to increase safety, functionality, and traffic operations.

Drainage Improvements

- Upgrading drainage at various locations along SR 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard and SR 5/US 1 to improve long-term resiliency.


Pedestrian and Safety Improvements

Pedestrian and Safety Improvements

- Restriping SR 5/US 1 to provide seven-foot bicycle lanes to enhance safety.
- Upgrading the existing lighting at signalized intersections to LED fixtures throughout the project corridors to increase nighttime visibility.
- Upgrading pedestrian signals with new technology at signalized intersections to improve push button accessibility.
- Reconstructing existing sidewalk curb ramps and replacing damaged sidewalk throughout the project limits to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians.


Existing Typical Section

SR 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard from west of SE Shelter Drive to SR 5/US 1




Proposed Typical Section

SR 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard from west of SE Shelter Drive to SR 5/US 1




Existing Typical Section

Maintenance of Traffic:

Lane closures on SR 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard and SR 5/US 1 are permitted as follows:

- Daily, single-lane closures from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday
- Nightly, single-lane closures from 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m., Sunday through Thursday
- Nightly, double-lane closures from 8:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., Sunday through Thursday
- Access to and from bus stops will be maintained throughout construction.

Construction Phases

Phase 1:

- Construct sidewalk, curb ramps, pedestrian signalization, and lighting improvements along eastbound SR 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard and northbound SR 5/US 1.
- Perform drainage work on SR 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard just east of SE Shelter Drive.
- Construct guardrail improvements along northbound SR 5/US 1.
- Widen the southeast quadrant of SR 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard at SE Morningside Boulevard and install stamped concrete in the median.
- Lengthen the northbound SR 5/US 1 left turn lane at Lennard Road.

Phase 2:


- Construct sidewalk, curb ramps, pedestrian signalization, and lighting improvements along westbound SR 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard and southbound SR 5/US 1.
- Widen the northwest quadrant of SR 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard at SE Morningside Boulevard.
- Construct guardrail along southbound SR 5/US 1.

Phase 3:

- Adjust manholes and valves along SR 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard and SR 5/US 1 within the project limits.
- Mill and repave the roadway throughout the project corridor and place final pavement markings.
- Install signage throughout the project limits.

 - Advanced warning and project signage will be placed throughout the construction corridor to alert the traveling public
 - **Local Agency & Stakeholder Coordination**
 - The project team will continue working closely with local stakeholders including local municipalities, schools, neighborhoods and other local agencies to ensure safety standards are met and impacts to the public are minimized in any way possible
 - **Emergency vehicles will be provided access at all times**


