## SR 806/ATLANTIC AVENUE AND HOMEWOOD BOULEVARD INTERSECTION AND SR 704/OKEECHOBEE BOULEVARD AND HAVERHILL ROAD INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is pleased to provide information regarding the upcoming SR 806/Atlantic Avenue and SR 704/Okeechobee Boulevard Intersection Improvements project. This project aims to enhance the safety, resiliency, and longevity of the infrastructure for our communities.

**Construction Cost:** \$3.2 Million

**Construction Start:** October 2025


**Estimated Completion:** Summer 2026

### PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Replacing existing traffic signals with mast arms at each intersection to improve infrastructure resiliency and enhance motorist safety.
- Extending the eastbound and westbound left turn lanes from SR 806/Atlantic Avenue to Homewood Boulevard and High Point Boulevard to improve traffic flow.
- Extending the eastbound left turn lane from SR 704/Okeechobee Boulevard to N Haverhill Road to improve traffic flow.
- Upgrading pedestrian signals with new LED countdown timers to enhance pedestrian use.
- Upgrading curb ramps and replacing sections of the existing sidewalk throughout the project limits to enhance pedestrian safety and connectivity.
- Installing new LED lighting at each intersection to improve nighttime visibility for all roadway users.
- Repaving and minor widening along Homewood Boulevard to improve bicycle and roadway facilities.

### TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Work will occur in phases to minimize impacts to the public.
- Lane closures are permitted nightly from 9:00 p.m. until 7:00 a.m.
- Sidewalk and curb ramp closures will be implemented as needed with temporary pedestrian detours.
- Access to businesses and residences will be maintained at all times.
