CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

INTERSTATES

- 1. SW 10th Street Connector Project from S.R. 869/Sawgrass Expressway to S.R. 9/I-95 and on S.R. 9/I-95 from north of S.R. 834/Sample Road to north of S.R. 810/Hillsboro Boulevard in the City of Deerfield Beach.**

Description: The SW 10th Street Connector Project is a major transportation improvement initiative that will enhance safety, improve traffic flow, and strengthen regional and local connectivity in the South Florida region. The project will create two separate roadway systems for regional and local travel by constructing dedicated SW 10th Street Connector lanes between the S.R. 869/Sawgrass Expressway and S.R. 9/I-95 while reconstructing local SW 10th Street with a 12-foot shared-use path for pedestrians and cyclists. Additional improvements include reconstruction of the S.R. 9/I-95 interchanges at SW 10th Street and S.R. 810/Hillsboro Boulevard, expansion of the I-95 Express Lanes, replacement of the NW/NE 48th Street bridge, and corridor-wide roadway, drainage, and safety enhancements. Together, these improvements will improve travel, reduce congestion, and support long-term regional transportation needs. Cost/Start: \$1.3 billion/ August 2026

Full Closure Traffic Impacts:

- The northbound S.R. 9/I-95 Managed Lanes, from SW 10th Street to the Palmetto Park Road exit, will be closed Sunday, July 19 to Thursday, July 23, from 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m., for geotechnical boring operations. Motorists traveling within the northbound S.R. 9/I-95 Managed Lanes will exit at SW

10th Street onto the General-Purpose Lanes. The next available entrance will be between S.R. 810/Hillsboro Boulevard and Palmetto Park Road.

Advanced Notice of Full Closure Traffic Impacts:

- **NW/NE 48th Street Bridge Advanced Full Closure Notice:** The NW/NE 48th Street Bridge over State Road (S.R.) 9/I-95 will close in both directions for full reconstruction beginning at 9 p.m. on Sunday, Aug. 2, and will remain closed through **Summer 2027** as part of the **Early Construction Works** phase of the **SW 10th Street Connector Project**.

To help ensure the safety of motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists, signed detour routes will be in place throughout the duration of the closure.

- **Regional traffic** will be directed to the primary state roadway network, including **SW 10th Street, S.R. 845/Powerline Road, S.R. 811/Dixie Highway, and S.R. 834/Sample Road**.
- **Local traffic** will be directed to alternate north-south routes, including **Military Trail and NE 3rd Avenue/FAU Research Park Boulevard**.

Advance warning signs and detour signage will be installed throughout the construction limits to help guide travelers safely through the area. **Access to homes, businesses, schools, and emergency services** will be maintained at all times during construction. Please see detour flyer attached.

- **Southbound S.R. 9/I-95 Advanced Full Closure Notice:** Southbound S.R. 9/I-95 between just south of SW 10th Street and S.R. 834/Sample Road will be closed to traffic from 11 p.m. until 5 a.m. on Sunday, Aug. 2, to perform traffic shift operations. During this operation, southbound traffic will be shifted to the outside lanes to establish a work zone for the upcoming demolition of the NW/NE 48th Street bridge over S.R. 9/I-95. One lane will close at 9 p.m., two lanes at 9:30 p.m., three lanes at 10:30 p.m., and all lanes will be closed by 11 p.m., reopening by 5 a.m.

Tuesday night, Aug. 4, will be used as a contingency night if needed.

Detour: Southbound motorists will be detoured via the SW 10th Street exit ramp, southbound Military Trail, and eastbound S.R. 834/Sample Road to re-enter southbound S.R. 9/I-95. The southbound S.R. 9/I-95 Express Lanes between S.R. 810/Hillsboro Boulevard and S.R. 814/Atlantic Boulevard will also be closed. Motorists may re-enter the Express Lanes by the S.R. 814/Atlantic Boulevard ingress.

In association with this full closure, the following entrance ramps to southbound S.R. 9/I-95 will also be closed:

- Southbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp from eastbound and westbound S.R. 810/Hillsboro Boulevard.
- Southbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp from eastbound and westbound SW 10th Street.
- Motorists seeking to access southbound S.R. 9/I-95 from these locations will be detoured via southbound S.R. 811/N. Dixie Highway and westbound S.R. 834/Sample Road.

To ensure the safety of the traveling public, Florida Highway Patrol (FHP) officers will be on site, and posted detour signage will be in place to guide

- **Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 Advanced Full Closure Notice:** Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 between just south of S.R. 834/Sample Road and SW 10th Street will be closed to traffic from 11 p.m. until 5 a.m. on Monday, Aug. 3, to perform traffic shift operations. During this operation, northbound traffic will be shifted to the outside lanes to establish a work zone for the upcoming demolition of the NW/NE 48th Street bridge over S.R. 9/I-95. One lane will close at 9 p.m., two lanes at 9:30 p.m., three lanes at 10:30 p.m., and all lanes will be closed by 11 p.m., reopening by 5 a.m. Wednesday night, Aug. 5, will be used as a contingency night if needed. **Detour:** Northbound motorists will be detoured via the S.R. 834/Sample Road exit ramp, northbound S.R. 811/N. Dixie Highway, and westbound SW 10th Street to re-enter northbound S.R. 9/I-95. The northbound S.R. 9/I-95 Express Lanes between S.R. 816/Oakland Park Boulevard and S.R. 834/Sample Road will also be closed. Motorists may re-enter the Express Lanes to the north of S.R. 810/Hillsboro Boulevard. In association with this full closure, the following entrance ramps to northbound S.R. 9/I-95 will also be closed:
 - Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp from eastbound and westbound Copans Road.
 - Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp from eastbound and westbound S.R. 834/Sample Road.
 - Motorists seeking to access northbound S.R. 9/I-95 from these locations will be detoured via northbound Military Trail and eastbound SW 10th Street.

- **Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 Advanced Full Closure Notice:** Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 between just south of S.R. 834/Sample Road and SW 10th Street will be closed to traffic from 11 p.m. until 5 a.m. on Thursday, Aug. 6, to remove an overhead Dynamic Message Sign. One lane will close at 9 p.m., two lanes at 9:30 p.m., three lanes at 10:30 p.m., and all lanes will be closed by 11 p.m., reopening by 5 a.m. **Detour:** Northbound motorists will be detoured via the S.R. 834/Sample Road exit ramp, northbound S.R. 811/N. Dixie Highway, and westbound SW 10th Street to re-enter northbound S.R. 9/I-95. The northbound S.R. 9/I-95 Express Lanes between S.R. 816/Oakland Park Boulevard and S.R. 834/Sample Road will also be closed. Motorists may re-enter the Express Lanes to the north of S.R. 810/Hillsboro Boulevard. In association with this full closure, the following entrance ramps to northbound S.R. 9/I-95 will also be closed:
 - Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp from eastbound and westbound Copans Road.

- Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp from eastbound and westbound S.R. 834/Sample Road.
- Motorists seeking to access northbound S.R. 9/I-95 from these locations will be detoured via northbound Military Trail and eastbound SW 10th Street.

- **Southbound S.R. 9/I-95 Advanced Full Closure Notice:** Southbound S.R. 9/I-95 between just south of SW 10th Street and S.R. 834/Sample Road will be closed to traffic from 11 p.m. until 5 a.m. on Tuesday, Aug. 11, Wednesday, Aug. 12, and Thursday, Aug. 13, for overhead bridge demolition operations. One lane will close at 9 p.m., two lanes at 9:30 p.m., three lanes at 10:30 p.m., and all lanes will be closed by 11 p.m., reopening by 5 a.m. Tuesday night, Aug. 4, will be used as a contingency night if needed. **Detour:** Southbound motorists will be detoured via the SW 10th Street exit ramp, southbound Military Trail, and eastbound S.R. 834/Sample Road to re-enter southbound S.R. 9/I-95. The southbound S.R. 9/I-95 Express Lanes between S.R. 810/Hillsboro Boulevard and S.R. 814/Atlantic Boulevard will also be closed. Motorists may re-enter the Express Lanes by the S.R. 814/Atlantic Boulevard ingress.

In association with this full closure, the following entrance ramps to southbound S.R. 9/I-95 will also be closed:

- Southbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp from eastbound and westbound S.R. 810/Hillsboro Boulevard.
- Southbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp from eastbound and westbound SW 10th Street.
- Motorists seeking to access southbound S.R. 9/I-95 from these locations will be detoured via southbound S.R. 811/N. Dixie Highway and westbound S.R. 834/Sample Road.

To ensure the safety of the traveling public, Florida Highway Patrol (FHP) officers will be on site, and posted detour signage will be in place to guide motorists safely through the designated detour routes.

- **Express Lanes Advanced Closure Notice:** The northbound S.R. 9/I-95 Express Lanes between S.R. 816/Oakland Park Boulevard and S.R. 834/Sample Road will be closed to traffic nightly from 9 p.m. until 5:30 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, beginning Thursday night, Aug. 6, through Thursday, Aug. 21, for temporary barrier wall installation and bridge overhead bridge demolition operations. Motorists will be directed to exit the Express Lanes onto the General-Purpose Lanes at S.R. 816/Oakland Park Boulevard and may re-enter the Express Lanes north of S.R. 810/Hillsboro Boulevard.
- **Express Lanes Advanced Closure Notice:** The southbound S.R. 9/I-95 Express Lanes between S.R. 810/Hillsboro Boulevard and S.R. 814/Atlantic Boulevard will be closed to traffic nightly from 9 p.m. until 5:30 a.m. Sunday through Thursday, beginning Thursday night, Aug. 6 through Thursday, Aug. 21, for temporary barrier wall installation and bridge overhead bridge

demolition operations. Motorists will be directed to exit the Express Lanes onto the General-Purpose Lanes at S.R. 810/Hillsboro Boulevard and may re-enter the Express Lanes by S.R. 814/Atlantic Boulevard.

Advanced Notice of S.R. 9/I-95 Lane Closures:

- Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 will have the two outside general-purpose lanes closed, between north of S.R. 834/Sample Road and SW 10th Street, from 9 p.m. until 5:30 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, beginning Sunday, Aug. 9, through Aug. 20, for temporary barrier wall placement and overhead bridge demolition operations.
- Southbound S.R. 9/I-95 will have the two outside general-purpose lanes closed, between north of SW 10th Street and S.R. 834/Sample Road, from 9 p.m. until 5:30 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, beginning Sunday, Aug. 9, through Aug. 20, for temporary barrier wall placement and overhead bridge demolition operations.

SW 10th Street & Arterial Traffic Impacts:

- Southbound SW 12th Avenue under the SW 10th Street Bridge will have one lane closed to traffic nightly as needed, from 8:30 p.m. until 5:30 a.m., Monday, July 27, to Thursday, July 30, for geotechnical operations. Flagging operations will be performed to assist motorists.

2. State Road (S.R.) 9/I-95 from south of S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard in the City of Hollywood to the south of S.R. 842/Broward Boulevard in the City of Fort Lauderdale and S.R. 862/I-595 from S.R. 9/I-95 to U.S. 441/S.R. 7 in the Town of Davie (95 Express Phase 3C)

Description: Work on this 9-mile 95 Express project includes extending the existing Express Lanes north from just south of S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard to just south of S.R. 842/Broward Boulevard in Broward County. One lane will be added, and the High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) lane will be converted to create two Express Lanes in each direction. The number of general-use lanes will remain the same. Other project improvements include the construction of I-95/I-595 Direct Connectors between S.R. 9/95 Express Lanes and S.R. 862/I-595, as well as reconstruction, milling, resurfacing, and widening of S.R. 862/I-595 from U.S. 441/S.R. 7 to S.R. 9/I-95 and along S.R. 9/I-95 from south of S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard to south of S.R. 842/Broward Boulevard. Additional work includes bridge widening along S.R. 9/I-95 at several locations, painting of 17 bridges within project limits, S.R. 9/I-95/S.R. 84 interchange modifications, Integrated Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) installation, including cameras, detectors, and dynamic message signs to optimize traffic operations, tolling/gantry construction, ramp signalization implementation at the interchanges, lighting, signage and drainage installation and construction of shoulder-mounted sound walls and retaining walls. Traffic Impacts:

S.R. 9/I-95 / S.R. 862/I-595 Full Mainline and Managed Lanes Upcoming Closures:

- **Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 Managed Lanes Full Closure:** The northbound S.R. 9/I-95 Managed Lanes, from S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard to S.R. 838/Sunrise

Boulevard, and the inside general-purpose lane will be closed from 9 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, as needed, for maintenance and punch list operations. The ingress north of S.R. 848/Stirling Road will also be closed. Motorists must egress north of S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard. The next available ingress is north of S.R. 816/Oakland Park Boulevard. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.

- **Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 Managed Lanes Full Closure:** The northbound Managed Lanes, from County Road (C.R.) 854/Ives Dairy Road to S.R. 822/Sheridan Street, and the inside general-purpose lane will be closed from 9 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for punch list operations and delineator maintenance. The Managed Lanes entrance at S.R. 858/Hallandale Beach Boulevard will also be closed. Motorists traveling within the northbound S.R. 9/I-95 Managed Lanes will exit at C.R. 854/Ives Dairy Road onto the General-Purpose Lanes. The next available entrance will be north of S.R. 822/Sheridan Street. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- **Southbound Managed Lanes Full Closure:** The southbound S.R. 9/I-95 Managed Lanes from S.R. 838/Sunrise Boulevard to S.R. 848/Stirling Road, and the inside general-purpose lane will be closed to traffic nightly as needed, 9 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for punch list operations. The Managed Lanes entrance at S.R. 816/Oakland Park Boulevard and the Broward Boulevard Park and Ride will also be closed. Motorists traveling within the southbound S.R. 9/I-95 Managed Lanes will exit at S.R. 838/Sunrise Boulevard onto the General-Purpose Lanes. The next available entrance will be at S.R. 822/Sheridan Street. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- **Southbound Managed Lanes Full Closure:** The southbound Managed Lanes, from S.R. 822/Sheridan Street to C.R. 854/Ives Dairy Road, and the inside general-purpose lane will be closed from 9 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for punch list operations. The Managed Lanes entrance at S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard will also be closed. Motorists traveling within the southbound S.R. 9/I-95 Managed Lanes will exit at S.R. 822/Sheridan Street onto the General-Purpose Lanes. The next available entrance will be at C.R. 854/Ives Dairy Road. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- **Northbound and Southbound Managed Lanes Direct Connector Closures:** The eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 inside lane and the northbound and southbound S.R. 9/I-95 direct connectors to the Managed lanes will be closed nightly as needed, Sunday through Thursday, from 9 p.m. until 5 a.m. for punch list operations. Motorists will be required to use the general-purpose ramps to access northbound or southbound S.R. 9/I-95. FHP will be on-site, and signage will be in place to assist motorists.

S.R. 9/I-95 Ramp and Traffic Impacts:

- **S.R. 9/I-95 Ramp Closure Notice:** The southbound S.R. 9/I-95 exit ramp to S.R. 818/Griffin Road will be closed to traffic overnight, from 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., on Monday, July 27, Tuesday, July 28, and Wednesday, July 29, for punch list operations. Motorists will be detoured via westbound S.R. 848/Stirling Road and northbound Anglers Avenue to access S.R. 818/Griffin Road. To ensure community and public safety, the eastbound and westbound S.R. 862/I-595 exit

ramp to S.R. 818/Griffin Road will also be closed. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.

- **S.R. 9/I-95 Ramp Closure Notice:** The southbound S.R. 9/I-95 exit ramp to S.R. 84/Marina Mile Boulevard will be closed to traffic overnight, from 10:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., on Thursday, July 30 and Sunday, Aug. 2, for Wrong Way Driving Systems testing. Motorists will be detoured via eastbound S.R. 736/Davie Boulevard and southbound U.S. 1/S.R. 5 to access S.R. 84/Marina Mile Boulevard. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.
- S.R. 9/I-95 in each direction, between S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard and S.R. 736/Davie Boulevard, may have up to four lanes closed, nightly as needed, from 8:30 p.m. until 5:30 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, for paving and vehicle detection loop installation. The first lane will close at 8:30 p.m., the second lane will close at 9 p.m., and the third and fourth lanes will close at 10 p.m. All lanes will be open by 5:30 a.m.
- S.R. 9/I-95 in each direction, from S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard to south of S.R. 736/Davie Boulevard, will have shoulder closures, daily and nightly, as needed, Sunday through Thursday.
- The northbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp from westbound S.R. 862/I-595 may have one lane closed nightly as needed, from 9:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- The southbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp from westbound S.R. 862/I-595 may have one lane closed nightly as needed, from 9:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- The southbound S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp from eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 may have one lane closed nightly as needed, from 9:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- The northbound and southbound S.R. 9/I-95 exit ramps to S.R. 818/Griffin Road may have two lanes closed intermittently, nightly as needed, from 9:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- The northbound and southbound S.R. 9/I-95 exit ramps to S.R. 848/Stirling Road may have two lanes closed intermittently, nightly as needed, from Sunday through Thursday.
- The northbound and southbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramps from S.R. 848/Stirling Road may have one lane closed intermittently, nightly as needed, from 9 p.m. until 5:30 a.m. Sunday through Thursday, for ITS and drilled shaft operations.
- ***Please note that ramp closures will be performed as needed per nighttime construction operations; consecutive ramps will not be closed at the same time.**

S.R. 862/I-595 Ramp Full Closures and Traffic Impacts:

- S.R. 862/I-595 in each direction, from east of U.S. 441/S.R. 7 to Anglers Avenue, may have up to four lanes closed nightly as needed, from 9 p.m. until 5:30 a.m., Sunday through Thursday. The first lane will close at 9 p.m., the second lane will close at 9:30 p.m., and the third and fourth lane will close at 10:30 p.m. All lanes will be open by 5:30 a.m.

- S.R. 862/I-595 in each direction, from U.S. 441/S.R. 7 to S.R. 9/I-95, will have shoulder closures, daily and nightly as needed, Sunday through Thursday.
- The eastbound and westbound S.R. 862/I-595 entrance ramp from southbound S.R. 9/I-95 may have two lanes closed nightly as needed, from 9:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- The westbound S.R. 862/I-595 entrance ramp from southbound S.R. 9/I-95 may have one lane closed nightly as needed, from 9:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- The eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 entrance ramp from northbound S.R. 9/I-95 may have one lane closed nightly as needed, from 9:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- The westbound S.R. 862/I-595 entrance ramp from northbound S.R. 9/I-95 may have one lane closed nightly as needed, 9:30 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- The westbound S.R. 862/I-595 westbound exit ramp to U.S. 441/S.R. 7 and the S.R. 91/Florida's Turnpike will have one lane closed nightly as needed, from 9 p.m. until 6 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- ***Please note that ramp closures will be performed as needed per nighttime construction operations; consecutive ramps will not be closed at the same time.**

Arterial Traffic Impact:

- SW 26th Terrace may have flagging operations as needed.
- S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard at S.R. 9/I-95 may have the shoulder closed in each direction daily as needed for directional bore operations.
- S.R. 818/Griffin Road, from Old Griffin Road and Anglers Avenue, may have up to two lanes closed in each direction nightly, 8:30 p.m. until 6 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.

3. State Road (S.R.) 838/Sunrise Boulevard at S.R. 9/I-95 Interchange Improvements and Resurfacing, Restoration, and Rehabilitation (RRR) Project in Fort Lauderdale

Description: The project improvements include widening S.R. 838/Sunrise Boulevard at the S.R. 9/I-95 Interchange overpass to accommodate dual right turn lanes onto northbound and southbound S.R. 9/I-95 to improve vehicular capacity and operations; widening the southbound S.R. 9/I-95 (Exit 29) off-ramp to accommodate triple left and triple right turn lanes onto S.R. 838/Sunrise Boulevard to improve vehicular capacity and operations; milling and resurfacing the existing roadway within the project limits to ensure long-term infrastructure resilience; installing new light poles with LED fixtures at the S.R. 9/I-95 Interchange to enhance nighttime visibility; installing Wrong-Way Driver detection systems on all ramps at the S.R. 9/I-95 Interchange to improve vehicular safety; upgrading existing signalization features to improve pushbutton accessibility and enhance pedestrian safety; adding a shared-use path on the S.R. 838/Sunrise Boulevard bridge over S.R. 9/I-95 to enhance pedestrian connectivity; and upgrading sidewalk curb ramps, pavement markings, and signage to enhance visibility and accessibility. Cost/Completion: \$55,449,488/Early 2029

Traffic Impacts:

- A temporary traffic shift on S.R. 9/I-95 at S.R. 838/Sunrise Boulevard has reduced the express lanes from two lanes to one lane in both directions to facilitate critical bridge construction. This configuration is expected to remain in place through Summer 2026 for ongoing improvements.
- S.R. 9/I-95 in each direction, between S.R. 842/Broward Boulevard and S.R. 816/Oakland Park Boulevard, may have up to two lanes closed, nightly as needed, 8 p.m. until 6 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.

S.R. 9/I-95 Ramp Impacts
