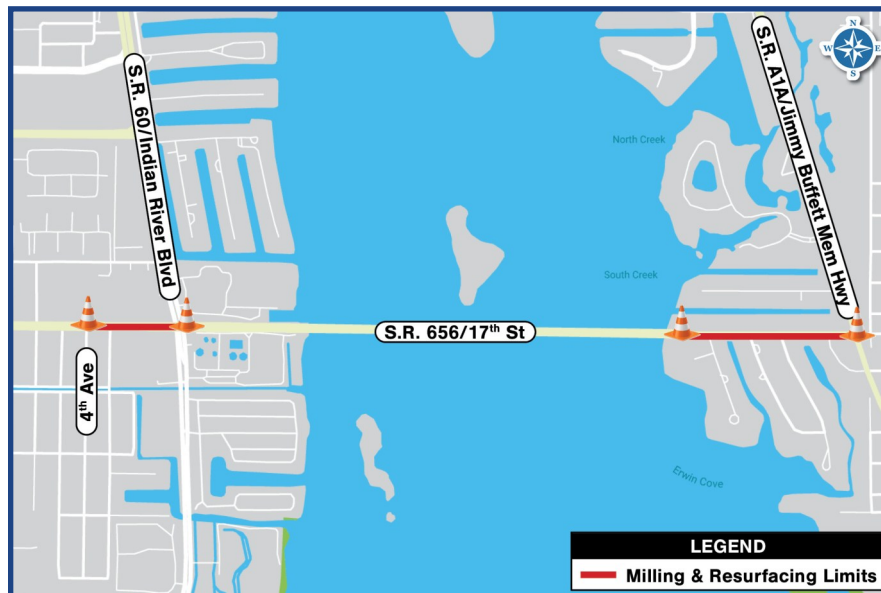
NIGHTTIME MILLING AND RESURFACING WORK ON S.R. 656/17TH STREET, MAY 17-21 AND MAY 26-28, 2026

To enhance safety and long-term resiliency, crews will implement nightly single-lane closures on eastbound and westbound S.R. 656/17th Street between S.R. A1A/Jimmy Buffett Memorial Highway and 4th Avenue for milling and resurfacing of the existing roadway. One lane will remain open in each direction at all times. The concrete bridge deck will not be milled and resurfaced.

This work will take place nightly, 9 p.m. to 7 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, beginning Sunday, May 17 through Thursday, May 21, and Tuesday, May 26 through Thursday, May 28, excluding Friday and Saturday nights. Signage will be in place to direct motorists. Sunday, May 31 through Thursday, June 4 will be used as contingency nights if needed, excluding Fridays, Saturdays, and holidays.

Residents and businesses near the project area may experience periodic noise, vibration, and dust during construction activities. The contractor will make every effort to minimize disruptions.
