I-95 SOUTHBOUND OUTSIDE DECELERATION LANE CLOSURE APPROACHING THE I-95 SOUTHBOUND EXIT RAMP TO BOYNTON BEACH BOULEVARD THROUGH LATE 2026

Beginning Monday night, June 1, crews will begin working to close the I-95 southbound outside deceleration lane approaching the I-95 southbound exit ramp to Boynton Beach Boulevard through late 2026 for widening and construction operations.

- The temporary outside deceleration lane closure will begin near the Boynton Canal and extend southbound to the bottom of the I-95 southbound exit ramp to Boynton Beach Boulevard
- One (1) deceleration lane will remain open during this time to access the I-95 southbound exit ramp to Boynton Beach Boulevard
- The I-95 southbound exit ramp to Boynton Beach Boulevard will remain in the regular configuration with two (2) lanes on the ramp and three (3) turn lanes onto Boynton Beach Boulevard
