LOXAHATCHEE ROAD IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT MONTHLY PROGRESS REPORT— JULY 2026

The City of Parkland, as the Project Sponsor, received funding through the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and requested that FDOT design and construct the Loxahatchee Road Improvements Project through the City of Parkland Resolution Numbers 2016-510, 2021-011, and 2021-018.

CURRENT MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC (MOT)

- **Traffic Impacts:** On Friday, May 1, eastbound and westbound traffic along Loxahatchee Road was shifted into its final configuration, separated by a median, from Bishop Pit Road to N. University Drive, with the exception of the culvert area.
- **Full Closure:** Loxahatchee Road from Parkside Drive to S.R.7/U.S. 441 is closed to traffic for phased construction improvements through Fall 2026. Traffic will be detoured via Parkside Drive, Holmberg Road, and S.R.7/U.S. 441. Please click [here](#) to view the detour flyer.
 - **Beginning Monday July 6, through Sunday, August 9, Loxahatchee Road from N. University Drive to Parkside Drive will be closed to traffic to install curbs for the median. Motorists will be detoured via N. University Drive, Holmberg Road, and Parkside Drive. Local access will be maintained at all times. Please click [here](#) to view the detour flyer.**
- **Sidewalk Closure:** To ensure pedestrian safety, the sidewalk on Loxahatchee Road between N. University Drive and Parkside Drive will be closed for sidewalk and handrail construction.
- **Speed Limit Enforcement:** Motorists are urged to adhere to posted speed limits. Law enforcement will be present throughout the construction period to monitor compliance and maintain safety.
- Additional lane closures, traffic shifts, and detours may be implemented as needed for ongoing construction. Every effort will be made to minimize impacts, and all future closures will be communicated well in advance to keep the community informed.
- **Pedestrians and cyclists are not permitted on Loxahatchee Road at this time.**

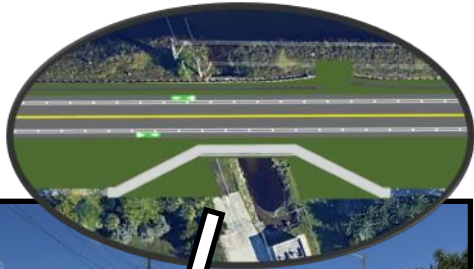
ANTICIPATED CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES FOR JULY 2026

Parkside Drive and S.R. 7/U.S. 441:

- Continue guardrail removal from NW 61st Way to S.R. 7/U.S. 441
- Continue sidewalk installation from Parkside Drive to NW 61st Way
- Continue drainage installation east of NW 61st Way
- Continue roadway paving operations east of Parkside Drive

West of North University Drive and Bishop Pit Road:

- Continue median curb installation
- Continue with Nob Hill Road roundabout construction
- Continue culvert extension installation
