S.R. 80/SOUTHERN BOULEVARD AND S.R. 7/U.S. 441 RAMP IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is pleased to provide information regarding the upcoming S.R. 80/Southern Boulevard and S.R. 7/U.S. 441 Ramp Improvements Project. This project aims to enhance the safety, resiliency, and longevity of the infrastructure for our communities.

Construction Cost: \$8.3 Million

Construction Start: February 2026

Estimated Completion: Summer 2027

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Milling and repaving the roadway throughout the project limits to enhance infrastructure resilience and improve safety for the community.
- Widening the roadway and C-51 canal bridge to accommodate dual right turn lanes along northbound and southbound S.R. 7/U.S. 441, triple left turn lanes along the eastbound and westbound S.R. 80/Southern Boulevard ramps, and dual right turn lanes along the eastbound and westbound S.R. 80/Southern Boulevard ramps to improve traffic flow and capacity.
- Reconstructing and signalizing the U-turns at the eastbound and westbound S.R. 80/Southern Boulevard ramps to enhance vehicular safety.
- Upgrading curb ramps and replacing sections of the existing sidewalks to improve pedestrian safety and connectivity.
- Installing new traffic signal mast arms to accommodate the turning lanes along S.R. 80/Southern Boulevard ramps and S.R. 7/U.S. 441.
- Upgrading pedestrian signals with new LED countdown timers at intersections throughout the project corridor to enhance pedestrian use.
- Retrofitting and installing new LED lighting to enhance motorist awareness and pedestrian visibility at night.
- Upgrading signage and pavement markings, including installing green bicycle markings, to enhance visibility and safety.

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Work will occur in phases to minimize impacts to the public.
- Single lane closures are permitted nightly along the S.R. 80/Southern Boulevard ramps from 7:00 p.m. until 7:00 a.m. and daily along S.R. 7/U.S. 441.
- Dual lane closures are permitted nightly along the S.R. 80/Southern Boulevard ramps from 7:00 p.m. until 7:00 a.m. and along S.R. 7/U.S. 441 from 9:00 p.m. until 7:00 a.m.
- Sidewalk and curb ramp closures will be implemented as needed with temporary pedestrian detours.
- Access to businesses and residences will be maintained at all times.
