SOUTH SIDE OF S.R. A1A/S. COUNTY ROAD AT S.R. 704/ROYAL PALM WAY INTERSECTION — NIGHTTIME CLOSURES IN SEPTEMBER 2026

Beginning Tuesday night, Sept. 1, 2026, nighttime closures with detours may be in place from 8 p.m. until 6 a.m. on the south side of the S.R. A1A/S. County Road and S.R. 704/Royal Palm Way intersection to install conduit for traffic signals and street lights. Work is expected to be performed for up to three (3) nights, Sunday through Thursday nights only.

Once work is completed, these operations are expected to move to additional S.R. A1A/S. County Road intersections at Worth Avenue and Peruvian Avenue. Please note, only one intersection within the project corridor on S.R. A1A/S. County Road from Hammon Avenue/Golfview Road to S.R. 704/Royal Palm Way will be closed at a time. Nightly operations for conduit installation can be expected through mid-September 2026.



S.R. A1A/S. County Road traffic at S.R. 704/Royal Palm Way will be detoured as follows (south side closure):

- Northbound traffic on S.R. A1A/S. County Road may detour via eastbound Brazilian Avenue to northbound S. Ocean Boulevard to westbound S.R. 704/Royal Palm Way to northbound S.R. A1A/S. County Road
- Southbound traffic on S.R. A1A/S. County Road may detour via westbound S.R. 704/Royal Palm Way to southbound Hibiscus Avenue to eastbound Brazilian Avenue to southbound S.R. A1A/S. County Road
- Pedestrian detours will be in place at the intersection; please follow directional signage as marked
- Please use caution, drive safely, and allow for extra travel time as needed
