## S.R. A1A FROM LAKE AVENUE TO IBIS WAY — APRIL 2026 PROJECT UPDATE

Wednesday, Apr. 1, 2026 marks day 334 of 401, with work 83% completed. Work operations through this Spring are focused on harmonization throughout the project, including placing the final layer of asphalt friction course and pavement markings along the corridor, installing sod and signage, and performing final inspections for project completion. ### CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

- Individual driveway tie-ins have been completed to ensure a smooth transition from the roadway to properties
- Beginning Monday night, April 6, the contractor is expected to place the final layer of asphalt friction course during a nighttime operation from 8 p.m. until 7 a.m., Sunday through Thursday nights; paving can be expected for 2 to 3 weeks, weather permitting
- In mid to late April, sod installation will begin once the final paving operation is complete; please see irrigation coordination info below
- In late Spring the contractor will install signage and begin punch list items and inspections for project completion
- The new pedestrian signal at the Palm Beach Par 3 Golf Course will be also be activated in late Spring
- A flagging operation with lane closures can be expected through Spring; driveway access will be maintained
- Work activities and the schedule may change as needed; additional updates will be provided as work progresses

### ANTICIPATED LANE CLOSURES

- One lane of S.R. A1A/S. Ocean Boulevard may be closed with a flagging operation to direct traffic, daily, 9 a.m. until 5 p.m., and nightly, 8 p.m. until 7 a.m., Sunday night through Friday, through Apr. 30, 2026
- One westbound lane of S.R. 802/Lake Avenue, just west of the S.R. A1A/S. Ocean Boulevard intersection, may be closed as needed, daily, 9 a.m. until 5 p.m., and nightly, 8 p.m. until 7 a.m., Sunday night through Friday, through Apr. 30, 2026
- Beginning May 1, 2026, daytime lane closures are permitted 8 a.m. until 6 p.m., Monday through Friday
- A temporary pedestrian detour route may be utilized for construction operations; please follow directional signage and proceed with caution through the work zone

### ONGOING COORDINATION WITH ADJACENT PROPERTIES AND ADDITIONAL INFO

- Sod will be placed on both sides of the roadway and between the new bike lane and pedestrian pathway once the final layer of asphalt friction course is completed
- **Irrigation must be present within the Right-of-Way for sod that requires watering, otherwise drought resistant sod will be placed per contract plans; if needed, please contact Hernando Garces, P.E. as soon as possible to discuss property irrigation adjustments prior to the sod installation**
- In addition to the Palm Beach Par 3 Golf Course pedestrian signal, a Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) at Phipps Ocean Park will be activated in late Spring to enhance pedestrian safety
- Property owners/managers may contact the team directly to review the plans, Right-of-Way lines, and upcoming activities; per request, a field meeting may also be scheduled at any time
