S.R. A1A FROM LAKE AVENUE TO IBIS WAY — NEW PEDESTRIAN SIGNAL AT THE PALM BEACH PAR 3 GOLF COURSE IS FLASHING YELLOW PRIOR TO FULL ACTIVATION

- The new pedestrian signal located just north of the entrance to the Palm Beach Par 3 Golf Course is currently flashing yellow to notify of the upcoming change in traffic pattern along S.R. A1A/S. Ocean Boulevard, just south of Old S. Ocean Boulevard
- The pedestrian signal will be fully activated to “red” in mid June 2026; when the push button is activated, the signal will turn from yellow to red to stop traffic and allow pedestrians to cross over S.R. A1A/S. Ocean Boulevard to either side
- Please proceed with caution and drive safely as this new traffic pattern is implemented



REMAINING CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES UNDERWAY

- Final sod, pavement marking/thermoplastic striping and signage installation
- Final punch list items and project inspections throughout the corridor
- Lane closures can be expected daily, 8 a.m. until 6 p.m., and nightly, 8 p.m. until 7 a.m., Sunday night through Friday as needed through early Summer 2026
