CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS **MARTIN COUNTY**

(Hobe Sound, Palm City, City of Stuart, Stuart, Jensen Beach, Jupiter Island, Port Salerno, Rio, Indiantown, Tequesta, Town of Sewall's Point)

1. United States (U.S.) 1/State Road (S.R.) 5 From SE Fisher Street To north of SE Decker Avenue Resurfacing, Restoration, and Rehabilitation (RRR) Project

Description: This 1.724-mile project on S.R. 5/U.S. 1 from north of southeast Fischer Street to north of southeast Decker Avenue in the City of Stuart and unincorporated Martin County began on May 5, 2025. The project improvements consist of milling and resurfacing the existing roadway within the project limits to enhance safety and long-term resiliency, widening the bicycle lane by restriping it from 4 feet to 5 feet to increase safety, constructing 25 new light poles with LED fixtures at signalized intersections to boost nighttime visibility, reconstructing existing sidewalk curb ramps throughout the project limits to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians, upgrading existing pedestrian signals at signalized intersections to improve push button accessibility, and upgrading signage and pavement markings to enhance safety, functionality, and traffic operations. Cost/Completion: \$7.5 million/Summer 2026

Traffic Impact:

- Northbound and southbound U.S. 1/S.R. 5 between north of SE Fischer Street and north of SE Decker Avenue will have two lanes intermittently closed, 8 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday, June 14, through Friday, June 19, for sign installation.

2. State Road (S.R.) 9/I-95 from south of S.R. 76/Kanner Highway to Martin/St. Lucie County Line Resurfacing, Restoration, and Rehabilitation (RRR) Project

Description: This 17.002-mile project on S.R. 9/I-95 from north of County Road (C.R.) 708/Bridge Road to the Martin/St. Lucie County line began on June 22, 2025. The project improvements consist of milling and resurfacing the S.R. 9/I-95 mainline from north of C.R. 708/Bridge Road to the Martin/St. Lucie County line to enhance safety and long-term resiliency; widening the northbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp shoulder from S.R. 76/Kanner Highway to improve safety and traffic operations; constructing new lighting to increase nighttime visibility; installing Wrong Way Vehicle Detection Systems (WWVDS) on S.R. 76/Kanner Highway, S.R. 714/Martin Highway, and C.R. 713/High Meadow Avenue ramps to improve safety; and upgrading signage and pavement markings to enhance safety, functionality, and traffic operations. Traffic Impact:

- Southbound S.R. 9/I-95 between C.R. 708/SE Bridge Road to the approach of Bridge 890111, at Martin/St. Lucie County line, will have two lanes closed, 7:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m., Sunday, June 14, through Friday, October 30, for signage, milling, and resurfacing.
- Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 between C.R. 708/SE Bridge Road to the approach of Bridge 890111, at the Martin/St. Lucie County line, will have two lanes closed, 8:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m., Sunday, June 14, through Friday, October 30, for milling and resurfacing.
- **Ramp Closure:** The entrance ramp to northbound S.R. 9/I-95 from S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway will be closed from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday, June 14, through Thursday, June 18, for milling and resurfacing. Motorists will be detoured to southbound S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway to the C.R. 711/Pratt-Whitney Road to eastbound C.R. 708/Bridge Road to the northbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp. The contingency dates due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances will be Sunday, June 21, through Thursday, June 25. Signage will be in place to assist motorists. Only one ramp closure will occur at a time.
- **Ramp Closure:** The exit ramp to C.R. 713/High Meadow Avenue from northbound S.R. 9/I-95 will be closed from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday, June 14, through Thursday, June 18, for milling and resurfacing. Motorists will be detoured via northbound S.R. 9/I-95 to the S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway exit ramp to northbound S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway to westbound S.R. 714/SW Martin Highway to C.R. 713/High Meadow Avenue. The contingency dates due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances will be Sunday, June 21, through Thursday, June 25. Signage will be in place to assist motorists. Only one ramp closure will occur at a time.
- **Ramp Closure:** The entrance ramp to northbound S.R. 9/I-95 from C.R. 713/High Meadow Avenue will be closed from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday, June 14,

through Thursday, June 18, for milling and resurfacing. Motorists will be detoured to southbound S.R. 9/I-95 to S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway to the S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway northbound entrance ramp. The contingency dates due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances will be Sunday, June 21, through Thursday, June 25. Signage will be in place to assist motorists. Only one ramp closure will occur at a time.

- **Ramp Closure:** The exit ramp to S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway (Exit 101) from northbound S.R. 9/I-95 will be closed from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday, June 14, through Thursday, June 18, for milling and paving operations. Motorists will be detoured to northbound S.R. 9/I-95 to the C.R. 713/High Meadow Avenue exit ramp (Exit 102) to northbound C.R. 713/High Meadow Avenue to eastbound S.R. 714/Martin Highway to S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway. The contingency dates due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances will be Sunday, June 21, through Thursday, June 25. Signage will be in place to assist motorists. Only one ramp closure will occur at a time.
- **Full Mainline Closure:** Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 south of S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway (Mile Marker 101), will be closed from 12 a.m. to 4 a.m., on Thursday, June 18, for the installation of overhead sign structures. Motorists traveling northbound on S.R. 9/I-95 will be detoured to westbound C.R. 708/SE Bridge Road, to northbound Pratt Whitney Road, to northbound S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway to the entrance ramp to northbound S.R. 9/I-95 at (Exit 101). The contingency dates due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances will be Thursday, June 25, and Thursday, July 9. Only one ramp closure will occur at a time.
- **Full Mainline Closure Advanced Notice:** Southbound S.R. 9/I-95 between S.R. 714/Martin Highway (Exit 110) and C.R. 713/High Meadow Avenue (Exit 102) will be closed from 12 a.m. to 4 a.m. on Thursday, June 25, and Thursday, July 9, for the installation of overhead sign structures. Motorists traveling southbound on S.R. 9/I-95 will be detoured via the exit ramp to eastbound S.R. 714/Martin Highway, then south on C.R. 713/High Meadow Avenue to the entrance ramp to southbound S.R. 9/I-95. Only one ramp closure will occur at a time.
- **Ramp Closure Advanced Notice:** The exit ramp to C.R. 708/SE Bridge Road (Exit 96) from southbound S.R. 9/I-95 will be closed from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday June 21, through Thursday June 25, for roadway construction. Motorists will be detoured to southbound S.R. 9/I-95 to the C.R. 713/High Meadow Avenue exit ramp (Exit 102) to northbound C.R. 713/High Meadow Avenue to S.R. 714/Martin Highway. The contingency dates due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances will be Sunday, June 28, through Thursday, July 2. Signage will be in place to assist motorists. Only one ramp closure will occur at a time.

3. S.R. A1A from NE Shore Village Terrace to S.R. 732/Jensen Beach Causeway (RRR) Project

Description: This 2.277-mile project began on March 23, 2026. The project improvements consist of milling and resurfacing of S.R. A1A/NE Ocean Boulevard to extend the service life of the road to provide long term resiliency, installing new

drainage structures to improve stormwater management, widening the shoulders to increase width to five-feet at select locations, upgrading the existing lighting at the Jensen Beach Causeway roundabout, upgrading of pedestrian curb ramps to comply with American with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards for improved safety and connectivity, and installation of traffic calming measures and speed feedback signs to enhance safety; and upgrading signage and pavement markings to increase safety, functionality, and traffic operations. Cost/Completion: \$4.9 million/Spring 2026

Traffic Impact:

- Northbound and southbound S.R. A1A/NE Ocean Boulevard from NE Shore Village Terrace to south of S.R. 732/Jensen Beach Causeway will have one lane intermittently closed, Monday, June 15, through Friday, June 19, for pavement widening and drainage work. During this time, two-way traffic will be maintained by a flagging operation.

4. State Road (S.R.) 714/SW Martin Highway Restoration, Resurfacing, and Rehabilitation Project from E to SW Stuart W Blvd to W of Citrus Blvd

Description: This 3.314-mile project on S.R. 714/SW Martin Highway from east of SW Stuart West Boulevard to west of Citrus Boulevard, in the city of Palm City and unincorporated Martin County, began in April 2026. The project improvements consist of milling and resurfacing the existing roadway within the project limits to enhance safety and long-term resiliency, widening eastbound and westbound SW Boat Ramp Avenue to accommodate turn lanes, installing new light poles at SW Boat Ramp Avenue to boost nighttime visibility, and upgrading signage and pavement markings to enhance safety, functionality, and traffic operations. - Eastbound and westbound S.R. 714/SW Martin Highway from east of SW Stuart W Boulevard to west of Citrus Boulevard will have roadway construction, Monday, June 15, through Friday, June 19, for milling and resurfacing.

5. State Road (S.R.) 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard and U.S. 1/State Road (S.R.) 5 Resurfacing, Restoration, and Rehabilitation (RRR) Project

Description: The project began on August 5, 2025. The project improvements consist of milling and repaving the existing roadways within the project limits to enhance safety and long-term resiliency; upgrading signalization at the intersections of Lennard Road, S.R. 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard, SE Morningside Boulevard, and SE Gowin Drive to improve traffic operations; modifying the lane configuration on Lennard Road at U.S. 1/S.R. 5 to enhance safety and traffic operations; upgrading the existing lighting at signalized intersections to LED fixtures throughout the project corridors to increase

nighttime visibility; upgrading pedestrian signals with new technology at signalized intersections to improve push button accessibility; reconstructing existing sidewalk curb ramps and replacing damaged sidewalk throughout the project limits to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians; upgrading drainage at various locations along S.R. 716/ SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard and U.S. 1/S.R. 5 to improve long-term resiliency; restriping U.S. 1/S.R. 5 to provide seven-foot bicycle lanes to enhance safety; and upgrading signage and pavement markings to increase safety, functionality, and traffic operations. - Westbound and eastbound S.R. 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard between SE Seafury Lane and SE Lennard Road will have one lane intermittently closed, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday, June 15, through Friday, June 19, for erosion control, excavation, drainage work, and sidewalk installation.
- Southbound and northbound S.R. 5/U.S. 1 between SE Jennings Road and NW Golden Oak Trail will have one lane closed, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday, June 15, through Friday, June 19, for erosion control, excavation, drainage work, and sidewalk installation.
- Westbound and eastbound S.R. 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard between SE Seafury Lane and SE Lennard Road will have two lanes closed, 8:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., Sunday, June 14, through Friday, June 19, for erosion control, drainage work, milling, and repaving operations.

6. SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard Widening Project from south of SW Paar Drive to south of SW Alcantarra Boulevard

Description: Construction began on Monday, September 8, 2025. The project improvements consist of widening SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard from a two-lane undivided roadway to a four-lane divided roadway, separated by an 18-foot wide median with stamped concrete and landscaping to improve safety and traffic operations; constructing new right-turn lanes on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard at the north and south approaches to SW Paar Drive to enhance traffic flow; constructing new signalized intersections with mast arms on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard at SW Paar Drive and SW McCall Road to improve safety and traffic operations; upgrading existing sidewalk curb ramps and constructing a new 8- to 10-foot wide sidewalk along both sides of SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard and adjacent side streets to improve pedestrian safety and connectivity; upgrading the existing lighting to LED fixtures and installing new light poles on the east side of the roadway within the project limits to improve safety for motorists and pedestrians; constructing a new drainage system to enhance functionality and long-term resiliency; and installing signage and pavement markings to improve safety, functionality, and traffic operations. - As part of the SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard Widening Project, beginning at 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday, June 15, through Friday, June 19, full road closures will occur on SW Jaslo Avenue, SW Jacoby Avenue, SW McCullough Avenue, SW McCall Road, and SW McHord Avenue, for the installation of drainage and utilities.  - Eastbound and westbound SW McCall Road closure between SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard and SW Kabane Street will detour motorists traveling northbound and southbound on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard to westbound SW McHord Avenue to southbound SW Kabane Street.
 - Eastbound and westbound SW McHord Avenue will be closed between Port St. Lucie Boulevard and SW Kabane Street. Motorists traveling northbound and southbound Port St. Lucie Boulevard will detour to westbound SW McDevitt Avenue or westbound SW McCall Road to SW Kabane Street.
- As part of the SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard Widening Project, beginning at 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Sunday, June 14, through Tuesday, June 23, full road closures will occur on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard, for the installation of drainage and utilities. - o Northbound and southbound SW Port Saint Lucie Boulevard will be closed between SW McCullough Avenue and SW McCall Road. Motorists traveling northbound on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard will detour eastbound SW McCullough Avenue to northbound SW McCrory Street to westbound SW McCall Road to SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard. Motorists traveling southbound on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard to eastbound SW McCall Road to southbound SW McCrory Street to westbound SW McCullough Avenue to SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard.
- o Northbound and southbound SW Port Saint Lucie Boulevard will be closed between SW Jaslo Avenue and SW Jacoby Avenue. Motorists traveling northbound on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard will detour eastbound SW Jaslo Avenue to northbound SW McCain Street to westbound SW Jacoby Avenue to SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard. - o Northbound and southbound SW Port Saint Lucie Boulevard will be closed between SW Paar Drive and SW Jaslo Avenue. 7. State Road (S.R.) 9/I-95 Roadway Improvement Project north of Glades Cut-Off Road to north of Florida's Turnpike/S.R. 91

Description: This 2.756-mile project on State Road (S.R.) 9/I-95 Roadway Improvement Project, north of Glades Cut-Off Road to north of Florida's Turnpike/S.R. 91, in the city of Fort Pierce, and unincorporated St. Lucie County will begin on June 2026. The project improvements consist of installing new Intelligent Transportation Systems or (ITS) devices, milling and resurfacing the existing roadway within the project limits to enhance safety and long-term resiliency, replacing the guardrail, and upgrading pavement markings and signage, to enhance safety, functionality, and traffic operations. Cost/Completion: \$5.1 million/Spring 2027

Traffic Impact:

- Northbound and southbound S.R. 9/I-95 between Glades Cut Off Road at (mile marker 123) and just south of S.R. 70/Okeechobee Road at (mile marker 128), will have up to two lanes closed from, 8:00 p.m., to 6:30 a.m., Sunday, June 14, through Friday, July 10, as needed, for milling, and repaving operations.

8. State Road (S.R.) A1A North Causeway Over the Intracoastal Waterway (ICWW) Bridge Replacement Project

Description: This project began on May 1, 2023. The S.R. A1A North Causeway Over the Intracoastal Waterway (ICWW) Bridge Replacement project improvements consist of constructing a new high-level fixed bridge connected directly to U.S. 1/S.R. 5 going over the Florida East Coast (FEC) Railroad, County Road (C.R.) 605/Old Dixie Highway, and the Intracoastal Waterway (ICWW) featuring: one 12-foot travel lane in each direction, navigational clearances of 85 feet vertical and 125 feet horizontal at the waterway channel, installing a barrier-protected 8-foot sidewalk on the south side of the bridge and a barrier-protected 12-foot shared use path on the north side of the bridge, installing 7-foot buffered bicycle lanes within the shoulders on both sides of S.R. A1A, constructing a 12-foot shared-use path along C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway to provide connectivity to the East Coast Greenway, building an observation deck beneath the west side of the new bridge structure, constructing a new access road under the bridge to businesses east of the FEC Railroad, extending Juanita Avenue from U.S. 1/S.R. 5 to C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway, and connecting U.S. 1/S.R. 5 and C.R.605/Old Dixie Highway along Sunny Lane. Cost/Completion: \$111.5 million/Late 2027

Channel Impact:

- **Partial Channel Closures:** Between dawn and dusk, Monday through Friday, through late 2026, in-water work will continue directly adjacent to, and at times partially restrict, the navigable waterway with barge(s) in order to perform maintenance work on the bascules of the existing bridge and perform other associated construction activities. At least 45 ft. width of the channel shall remain open at all times. Vessels needing a full channel passage are required to provide the bridge tender with a 120-minute advance notice to allow for the barge to clear the channel. During the evening/overnight hours, the channel will remain unobstructed, maintaining a minimum channel width of 45 ft. All in-water

equipment will be properly lit. All mariners are requested to use caution and transit the area at a slow speed. For waterways questions or drawbridge operating issues, please contact the USCG Sector Miami Waterways Division at 305-535-4317 or sectormiamiwaterways@uscg.mil.

- **Full Channel Closures:** Intermittent full channel closures may occur for up to 6 hours between dawn and dusk, Monday through Friday, through Tuesday, June 30, 2026, for removal of the steel bascule bridge spans in the main navigation channel. Vessels that require full channel access must provide the bridge tender with a 120-minute advanced notice to allow the work barges to clear the channel. The vertical clearance was permanently reduced to 85 feet on Thursday, April 17, 2025. The channel will be unobstructed during the evening, and all in-water equipment will be properly lighted. All mariners should exercise caution and navigate the area at a slow speed. Traffic Impact:

- Signal operations may be impacted by project activities and are being monitored closely during construction for temporary adjustments to reduce congestion.
- The new S.R. A1A North Causeway Bridge over the ICWW connecting directly to U.S. 1/S.R. 5 opened to the traveling public on Friday, May 15, 2026. At opening:
 - The eastbound and westbound S.R. A1A bicycle lanes and the shared-use path along S.R. A1A on the north side of the bridge remain closed as construction activities continue. Pedestrians are detoured to the sidewalk on the south side of the bridge.
 - The observation deck at the west end of the new bridge is also closed during this construction phase.

 - Please note that the new bridge does not connect to C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway.
 - Accessing U.S. 1/S.R. 5 and C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway:
 - Motorists traveling along U.S. 1/S.R. 5 can access C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway via Juanita Avenue.
 - Motorists traveling along C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway can access northbound and southbound U.S. 1/S.R. 5 via Juanita Avenue and northbound U.S. 1/S.R. 5 only via Sunny Lane. Please [click here](#) to view the graphic.
- U.S. 1/S.R. 5 between the Juanita Avenue intersection and Naco Road will have one northbound lane closed, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through June 2026, for roadway construction and installation of overhead signage.
- To enhance safety and long-term resiliency, the S.R. A1A and C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway intersection was shifted slightly south on Monday, April 28, 2025, to facilitate the construction of the west end of the new North Causeway Bridge. Please note that the traffic lights at the S.R. A1A and C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway intersection were removed and replaced with a 2-way stop.

- To enhance safety and long-term resiliency, eastbound and westbound traffic on S.R. A1A east of the park was shifted approximately 25 feet to the north on July 21, 2025. This shift is expected to last through late Spring/early Summer 2026 to allow for permanent roadway construction.

9. County Road (C.R.) 712/Midway Road Widening Project from west of Jenkins Road to Selvitz Road

Description: This 0.785-mile project began on April 1, 2024. The project improvements include widening C.R. 712/Midway Road from a two-lane undivided roadway to a four-lane divided roadway. The eastbound and westbound lanes of C.R. 712/Midway Road will be separated by a raised landscaped median. Additional improvements include constructing left turn lanes in the median to allow access to adjacent side streets, properties and businesses, constructing 7-foot buffered bicycle lanes on both sides of C.R. 712/Midway Road, constructing 6-foot sidewalk along the north side of C.R. 712/Midway Road, constructing a 12-foot bicycle/pedestrian path along the south side of the project, installing landscaping along the south side of the project, and upgrading
