CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS **MARTIN COUNTY**

(Hobe Sound, Palm City, City of Stuart, Stuart, Jensen Beach, Jupiter Island, Port Salerno, Rio, Indiantown, Tequesta, Town of Sewall's Point)

1. United States (U.S.) 1/State Road (S.R.) 5 From SE Fisher Street To north of SE Decker Avenue Resurfacing, Restoration, and Rehabilitation (RRR) Project

Description: This 1.724-mile project on S.R. 5/U.S. 1 from north of southeast Fischer Street to north of southeast Decker Avenue in the City of Stuart and unincorporated Martin County began on May 5, 2025. The project improvements consist of milling and resurfacing the existing roadway within the project limits to enhance safety and long-term resiliency, widening the bicycle lane by restriping it from 4 feet to 5 feet to increase safety, constructing 25 new light poles with LED fixtures at signalized intersections to boost nighttime visibility, reconstructing existing sidewalk curb ramps throughout the project limits to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians, upgrading existing pedestrian signals at signalized intersections to improve push button accessibility, and upgrading signage and pavement markings to enhance safety, functionality, and traffic operations. 2. State Road (S.R.) 9/I-95 from south of S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway to Martin/St. Lucie County Line Resurfacing, Restoration, and Rehabilitation (RRR) Project

Description: This 17.002-mile project on S.R. 9/I-95 from north of County Road (C.R.) 708/SE Bridge Road to the Martin/St. Lucie County line began on June 22, 2025. The project improvements consist of milling and resurfacing the S.R. 9/I-95 mainline from north of C.R. 708/SE Bridge Road to the Martin/St. Lucie County line to enhance safety and long-term resiliency; widening the northbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp shoulder from S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway to improve safety and traffic operations; constructing new lighting to increase nighttime visibility; installing Wrong Way Vehicle Detection Systems (WWVDS) on S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway, S.R. 714/SW Martin Highway, and C.R. 713/SW High Meadow Avenue ramps to improve safety; and upgrading signage and pavement markings to enhance safety, functionality, and traffic operations. - Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 from C.R. 708/SE Bridge Road to the approach of Bridge 890111 at the Martin/St. Lucie County line, will have two lanes closed, 8:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. Tuesday, September 8, through Friday, October 30, for milling and resurfacing. - **Ramp Closure:** The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound exit ramp to S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway (Exit 101) will be closed from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Tuesday, September 8, through Thursday, September 10, for milling and resurfacing. Motorists will be detoured southbound on S.R. 9/I-95, to C.R. 708/SE Bridge Road exit ramp (Exit 96), to eastbound C.R. 708/SE Bridge Road, to northbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp, to S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway. The contingency dates due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances will be Sunday, September 13, through Thursday, September 17. Detour signage will be in place to assist motorists. Only one ramp closure will occur at a time.
- **Ramp Closure:** The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp from S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway will be closed from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Tuesday, September 8, through Thursday, September 10, for milling and resurfacing. Motorists will be detoured westbound S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway, to eastbound C.R. 711/Pratt Whitney Road to continue southbound C.R. 711/Pratt-Whitney Road to eastbound C.R. 708/SE Bridge Road to the entrance ramp to southbound S.R. 9/I-95. The contingency dates due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances will be Sunday, September 13, through Thursday, September 17. Detour signage will be in place to assist motorists. Only one ramp closure will occur at a time.
- **Ramp Closure:** The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound exit ramp to C.R. 713/SW High Meadow Avenue (Exit 102) will be closed from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Tuesday, September 8, through Thursday, September 10, for milling and resurfacing. Motorists will be detoured southbound on S.R. 9/I-95 to the S.R. 76/SW Kanner

Highway exit ramp (Exit 101), to eastbound S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway, to the northbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp, to the C.R. 713/SW High Meadow Avenue exit ramp (Exit 102). The contingency dates due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances will be Sunday, September 13, through Thursday, September 17. Detour signage will be in place to assist motorists. Only one ramp closure will occur at a time.

- **Ramp Closure:** The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp from C.R. 713/SW High Meadow Avenue will be closed from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Tuesday, September 8, through Thursday, September 10, for milling and resurfacing. Motorists will be detoured to northbound C.R. 713/SW High Meadow Avenue, to eastbound S.R. 714/SW Martin Highway to southbound S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway to the entrance ramp to southbound S.R. 9/I-95. The contingency dates due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances will be Sunday, September 13, through Thursday, September 17. Detour signage will be in place to assist motorists. Only one ramp closure will occur at a time.
- **Ramp Closure Advanced Notice:** The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound exit ramp to C.R. 708/SE Bridge Road (Exit 96) will be closed from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday, September 13, through Thursday, September 17, for milling and resurfacing. Motorists will be detoured from southbound S.R. 9/I-95 at the S.R. 76/SW Kanner Highway exit ramp to southbound C.R. 711/Pratt-Whitney Road to the eastbound C.R. 708/SE Bridge Road. The contingency dates due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances will be Sunday, September 20, through Thursday, September 24. Detour signage will be in place to assist motorists. Only one ramp closure will occur at a time.

3. S.R. A1A from NE Shore Village Terrace to S.R. 732/Jensen Beach Causeway (RRR) Project

Description: This 2.277-mile project began on March 23, 2026. The project improvements consist of milling and resurfacing of S.R. A1A/NE Ocean Boulevard to extend the service life of the road to provide long-term resiliency, installing new drainage structures to improve stormwater management, widening the shoulders to increase width to five feet at select locations, upgrading the existing lighting at the Jensen Beach Causeway roundabout, upgrading pedestrian curb ramps to comply with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards for improved safety and connectivity, and installing traffic calming measures and speed feedback signs to enhance safety; and upgrading signage and pavement markings to increase safety, functionality, and traffic operations. Cost/Completion: \$4.9 million/Spring 2027

Traffic Impact:

- Northbound and southbound S.R. A1A/NE Ocean Boulevard from NE Shore Village Terrace to south of S.R. 732/Jensen Beach Causeway, will have one lane closed intermittently, Tuesday, September 8, through Friday, September 11, for pavement widening and drainage work. During this time, two-way traffic will be maintained by a flagging operation.

- **Advanced Notice:** Northbound and southbound S.R. A1A/NE Ocean Boulevard/S Ocean Drive from Rigels Cove Way to NE Jensen Beach Club, at the Jensen Beach entrance, will have the roundabout lane closed intermittently, 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday, September 13, through Thursday, September 17, for lighting installation. The contingency dates due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances will be Sunday, September 20, through Thursday, September 24. During this time, traffic will be maintained by a flagging operation.

4. State Road (S.R.) 714/SW Martin Highway Restoration, Resurfacing, and Rehabilitation Project from east of SW Stuart West Boulevard to west of Citrus Boulevard

Description: This 3.314-mile project on S.R. 714/SW Martin Highway from east of SW Stuart West Boulevard to west of Citrus Boulevard, in the city of Palm City and unincorporated Martin County, began in April 2026. The project improvements consist of milling and resurfacing the existing roadway within the project limits to enhance safety and long-term resiliency, widening eastbound and westbound SW Boat Ramp Avenue to accommodate turn lanes, installing new light poles at SW Boat Ramp Avenue to boost nighttime visibility, and upgrading signage and pavement markings to enhance safety, functionality, and traffic operations. During this time, two-way traffic will be maintained by a flagging operation.

5. State Road (S.R.) 9/I-95 from south of SW Becker Road to south of S.R. 716/SW Gatlin Boulevard & S.R. 716/SW Tradition Parkway

Description: This 5.070-mile project on State Road (S.R.) 9/I-95 from south of SW Becker Road to south of S.R. 716/SW Gatlin Boulevard & S.R. 716/SW Tradition Parkway, in the city of Port St. Lucie, and unincorporated St. Lucie County will begin in July 2026. The project improvements consist of installing new Intelligent Transportation Systems or (ITS) devices, milling and resurfacing the existing roadway within the project limits to enhance safety and long-term resiliency, replacing the guardrail, and upgrading pavement markings and signage to enhance safety, functionality, and traffic operations. - Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 between S.R. 716/SW Gatlin Boulevard (mile marker 118) and just south of SW Becker Road (mile marker 114), will have two lanes closed, with possible lane shifts, from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Tuesday, September 8, through Friday, September 11, for milling and repaving operations.
- Southbound S.R. 9/I-95 between S.R. 716/SW Gatlin Boulevard (mile marker 118) and just south of SW Becker Road (mile marker 114), will have two lanes closed, with possible lane shifts, from 7:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. Tuesday, September 8, through Friday, September 11, for milling and repaving operations. Motorists will continue along SW Becker Road to southbound SW Newfield Parkway to westbound S.R. 714/SW Martin Highway to the S.R. 9/I-95 southbound entrance ramp. Detour signage will be in place to assist motorists. Only one ramp closure will occur at a time.
- **Ramp Closure:** The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound exit ramp to SW Becker Road (Exit 114) will be closed from 7:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. Tuesday, September 8, and Wednesday, September 9, for milling and resurfacing. Motorists will be detoured to the eastbound S.R. 714/SW Martin Highway exit ramp (Exit 110) to eastbound S.R. 714/SW Martin Highway to northbound SW Newfield Parkway to SW Becker Road. The contingency date due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances will be Thursday, September 10. Detour signage will be in place to assist motorists. Only one ramp closure will occur at a time.
- **Ramp Closure:** The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound entrance ramp to SW Becker Road will be closed from 7:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. Thursday, September 10, and Sunday, September 13, for milling and resurfacing. Motorists will be detoured to westbound SW Becker Road to northbound Village Parkway to eastbound SW Tradition Parkway/SW Gatlin Boulevard to the northbound S.R. 9/I-95 entrance ramp. The contingency date due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances will be Monday, September 14. Detour signage will be in place to assist motorists. Only one ramp closure will occur at a time.
- **Ramp Closure Advanced Notice:** The S.R. 9/I-95 northbound exit ramp to SW Gatlin Boulevard/SW Tradition Parkway (Exit 118) will be closed from 7:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. Monday, September 14, and Tuesday, September 15, for milling and resurfacing. Motorists will be detoured to the westbound SW Becker Road exit ramp (Exit 114) to northbound Village Parkway to SW Tradition Parkway/SW Gatlin Boulevard. The contingency date due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances will be Wednesday, September 16. Detour signage will be in place to assist motorists. Only one ramp closure will occur at a time.
- **Ramp Closure Advanced Notice:** The S.R. 9/I-95 southbound exit ramp to SW Becker Road (Exit 114) will be closed from 7:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. Monday, September 21, for milling and resurfacing. 6. State Road (S.R.) 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard and U.S. 1/State Road (S.R.) 5 Resurfacing, Restoration, and Rehabilitation (RRR) Project

Description: The project began on August 5, 2025. The project improvements consist of milling and repaving the existing roadways within the project limits to enhance safety and long-term resiliency; upgrading signalization at the intersections of Lennard Road, S.R. 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard, SE Morningside Boulevard, and SE Gowin Drive to improve traffic operations; modifying the lane configuration on Lennard Road at U.S. 1/S.R. 5 to enhance safety and traffic operations; upgrading the existing lighting at signalized intersections to LED fixtures throughout the project corridors to increase nighttime visibility; upgrading pedestrian signals with new technology at signalized intersections to improve push button accessibility; reconstructing existing sidewalk curb ramps and replacing damaged sidewalk throughout the project limits to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians; upgrading drainage at various locations along S.R. 716/SE Port St. Lucie Boulevard and U.S. 1/S.R. 5 to improve long-term resiliency; restriping U.S. 1/S.R. 5 to provide seven-foot bicycle lanes to enhance safety; and upgrading signage and pavement markings to increase safety, functionality, and traffic operations. 7. SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard Widening Project from south of SW Paar Drive to south of SW Alcantarra Boulevard

Description: Construction began on Monday, September 8, 2025. The project improvements consist of widening SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard from a two-lane undivided roadway to a four-lane divided roadway, separated by an 18-foot wide median with stamped concrete and landscaping to improve safety and traffic operations; constructing new right-turn lanes on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard at the north and south

approaches to SW Paar Drive to enhance traffic flow; constructing new signalized intersections with mast arms on SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard at SW Paar Drive and SW McCall Road to improve safety and traffic operations; upgrading existing sidewalk curb ramps and constructing a new 8- to 10-foot wide sidewalk along both sides of SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard and adjacent side streets to improve pedestrian safety and connectivity; upgrading the existing lighting to LED fixtures and installing new light poles on the east side of the roadway within the project limits to improve safety for motorists and pedestrians; constructing a new drainage system to enhance functionality and long-term resiliency; and installing signage and pavement markings to improve safety, functionality, and traffic operations. - As part of the SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard Widening Project, extended overnight road closures will occur intermittently on SW McCall Road, SW McHord Avenue, SW Paar Drive, SW Koler Avenue, SW McDevitt Avenue, SW McComb Avenue, and SW McCoy Avenue, for the installation of drainage and utilities. Closures may begin at 7 a.m. on Tuesday, September 8, with roads reopening at 5 p.m. on Friday, September 11. Adjacent road closures will not occur at the same time. 8. State Road (S.R.) 9/I-95 Roadway Improvement Project north of Glades Cut-Off Road to north of Florida's Turnpike/S.R. 91

Description: This 2.756-mile project on State Road (S.R.) 9/I-95 Roadway Improvement Project, north of Glades Cut-Off Road to north of Florida's Turnpike/S.R. 91, in the city of Fort Pierce, and unincorporated St. Lucie County will begin in June 2026. The project improvements consist of installing new Intelligent Transportation Systems or (ITS) devices, milling and resurfacing the existing roadway within the project limits to enhance safety and long-term resiliency, replacing the guardrail, and upgrading pavement markings and signage to enhance safety, functionality, and traffic operations. Traffic Impact:

- Northbound and southbound S.R. 9/I-95 between Glades Cut Off Road (mile marker 123) and just south of S.R. 70/Okeechobee Road (mile marker 128), will have the shoulder lanes closed from 8 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. Tuesday, September

8, through Friday, September 11, as needed, for guardrail, ITS, and drill shaft operations.

9. State Road (S.R.) A1A North Causeway Over the Intracoastal Waterway (ICWW) Bridge Replacement Project

Description: This project began on May 1, 2023. The S.R. A1A North Causeway Over the Intracoastal Waterway (ICWW) Bridge Replacement project improvements consist of constructing a new high-level fixed bridge connected directly to U.S. 1/S.R. 5 going over the Florida East Coast (FEC) Railroad, County Road (C.R.) 605/Old Dixie Highway, and the Intracoastal Waterway (ICWW) featuring: one 12-foot travel lane in each direction, navigational clearances of 85 feet vertical and 125 feet horizontal at the waterway channel, installing a barrier-protected 8-foot sidewalk on the south side of the bridge and a barrier-protected 12-foot shared use path on the north side of the bridge, installing 7-foot buffered bicycle lanes within the shoulders on both sides of S.R. A1A, constructing a 12-foot shared-use path along C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway to provide connectivity to the East Coast Greenway, building an observation deck beneath the west side of the new bridge structure, constructing a new access road under the bridge to businesses east of the FEC Railroad, extending Juanita Avenue from U.S. 1/S.R. 5 to C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway, and connecting U.S. 1/S.R. 5 and C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway along Sunny Lane. Cost/Completion: \$111.5 million/Late 2027

Channel Impact:

- As of 6 p.m. on August 8, 2026, the drawbridge operation regulation is obsolete and is no longer being enforced. The new fixed high-level S.R. A1A/E.C. Summerlin Family Bridge now spans the navigable channel, which permanently limits the vertical clearance to 85 feet at mean high water. All mariners should exercise caution and navigate the area at a slow speed. - **Partial Channel Closures – Monday, August 31 – Monday, December 1, 2026:** The new high-level fixed S.R. A1A/E.C. Summerlin Family Bridge opened to motorists on Friday, May 15, 2026, and spans the navigable channel which permanently limits the vertical clearance to 85 feet at mean high water. Demolition of the bascule bridge is ongoing. The bascule piers will be removed from the waterway utilizing cofferdams. The navigation channel will be partially obstructed beginning Monday, August 31, 2026, through Monday, December 1, 2026, as follows:
 - Beginning Monday, August 31 through Wednesday, September 9, 2026, the channel will be partially obstructed providing 50 feet of horizontal clearance for the passage of vessels.
 - From Wednesday, September 9 through Monday, September 14, 2026, the channel will be partially obstructed providing 40 feet of horizontal clearance for the passage of vessels between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m., daily. A full channel passage will be available with one hour notice to

the on-scene tug "MANDI" on VHF-FM marine radio channel 13. Outside work hours, 85 feet of horizontal clearance will be available.

- From Monday, September 14 through Wednesday, September 23, 2026, the channel will be partially obstructed providing 40 feet of horizontal clearance for the passage of vessels.
- From Wednesday, September 23 through Monday, December 1, 2026, the channel will be partially obstructed providing 40 feet of horizontal clearance for the passage of vessels between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m., daily. A full channel passage will be available with 1 hour notice to the on-scene tug "MANDI" on VHF-FM marine radio channel 13. Outside work hours, 85 feet of horizontal clearance will be available.
- A temporary work trestle (platform) has been installed on the northeast side of the bridge. In water work continues directly adjacent to and across the navigable waterway with barge(s) in order to perform other associated construction activities.
- All in-water equipment will be properly lighted. All mariners are requested to use caution and transit the area at a slow speed.

Traffic Impact:

- Signal operations may be impacted by project activities and are being monitored closely during construction for temporary adjustments to reduce congestion.
- The new S.R. A1A North Causeway Bridge over the ICWW connecting directly to U.S. 1/S.R. 5 opened to the traveling public on Friday, May 15, 2026. At opening:
 - The eastbound and westbound S.R. A1A bicycle lanes and the shared-use path along S.R. A1A on the north side of the bridge remain closed as construction activities continue. Pedestrians are detoured to the sidewalk on the south side of the bridge.
 - The observation deck at the west end of the new bridge is also closed during this construction phase.
 - The existing drawbridge was permanently closed to vehicular traffic and demolished as part of the final phase of work through Late 2027.
 - Please note that the new bridge does not connect to C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway.
 - Accessing U.S. 1/S.R. 5 and C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway:
 - Motorists traveling along U.S. 1/S.R. 5 can access C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway via Juanita Avenue.
 - Motorists traveling along C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway can access northbound and southbound U.S. 1/S.R. 5 via Juanita Avenue and northbound U.S. 1/S.R. 5 only via Sunny Lane. Please [click here](#) to view the graphic.
- U.S. 1/S.R. 5 between the Juanita Avenue intersection and Naco Road will have one northbound lane closed, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through September 2026, for roadway construction.
- To enhance safety and long-term resiliency, the S.R. A1A and C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway intersection was shifted slightly south on Monday, April 28, 2025, to

facilitate the construction of the west end of the new North Causeway Bridge. Please note that the traffic lights at the S.R. A1A and C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway intersection were removed and replaced with a 2-way stop.

- To enhance safety and long-term resiliency, eastbound and westbound traffic on S.R. A1A east of the park was shifted approximately 25 feet to the north on July 21, 2025. This shift is expected to last through September 2026 to allow for permanent roadway construction.
- Northbound and southbound traffic on C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway, approximately 200 feet from the S.R. A1A intersection was shifted slightly to the west on Monday, Aug. 4, 2025, for pile driving work adjacent to the railroad tracks.
- Juanita Avenue east of U.S. 1/S.R. 5 is open to motorists. The new traffic signal at the intersection of Juanita Avenue and U.S. 1/S.R. 5 is activated.
- Juanita Avenue west of U.S. 1/S.R. 5 will have the westbound lane closed, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through September 2026, for installation of drainage catch basins. A flagging operation will be in place to assist motorists.
- Harbortown Drive will have one lane closed in either direction, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through September 2026, for roadway construction. A flagging operation will be in place to assist motorists.
- U.S. 1/S.R. 5 between NE 3rd Street and the Juanita Avenue intersection will have one northbound lane closed, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through September 2026, for roadway construction and right turn lane extension.
- C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway between Sunny Lane and Juanita Avenue will have one lane in either direction closed, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through September 2026, for roadway reconstruction. A flagging operation will be in place to maintain local traffic.
- Marina Access from C.R. 605/Old Dixie Highway to the North Causeway Bridge will have one lane closed in either direction, Monday through Friday, through September 2026, for roadway construction. A flagging operation will be in place to maintain local traffic.
- Northbound and southbound U.S. 1/S.R. 5 from the Taylor Creek Bridge to 500 feet north of Juanita Avenue will have one lane closed in either direction, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through September 2026, for roadway construction.
- Juanita Avenue, east of U.S. 1/S.R. 5, will have one westbound turn lane closed, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, through September 2026, for roadway work. A flagging operation will be in place to assist motorists.

10. County Road (C.R.) 712/Midway Road Widening Project from west of Jenkins Road to Selvitz Road

Description: This 0.785-mile project began on April 1, 2024. The project improvements include widening C.R. 712/Midway Road from a two-lane undivided roadway to a four-lane divided roadway. The eastbound and westbound lanes of C.R. 712/Midway Road will be separated by a raised landscaped median. Additional improvements include constructing left turn lanes in the median to allow access to adjacent side streets, properties and businesses, constructing 7-foot buffered bicycle lanes on both sides of

C.R. 712/Midway Road, constructing a 6-foot sidewalk along the north side of C.R. 712/Midway Road, constructing a 12-foot bicycle/pedestrian path along the south side of the project, installing landscaping along the south side of the project, and upgrading drainage, signage and pavement markings. Cost/Completion: \$23.5 million/Early 2027

Traffic Impact:

- Eastbound or westbound C.R. 712/Midway Road between Florida's Turnpike and Selvitz Road, will have one lane closed intermittently, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday, through September 2026, to facilitate roadway reconstruction.
- As part of the C.R. 712/Midway Road Widening Project, westbound traffic was shifted north onto the newly constructed lanes, between NW Corporate Way and Selvitz Road. The project improvements consist of milling and resurfacing the existing roadway within the project limits to enhance safety and long-term resiliency and implementing the approved safety recommendations, which include the installation of high friction surface treatment along the loop ramp, widening the outside shoulder for the length of the loop ramp, installation of pedestrian crossing and chevron signs along the ramp, and to enhance the existing lighting along the ramp by replacing existing light poles to enhance safety, functionality, and traffic operations. In partnership with Indian River County, FDOT is pleased to announce the construction of the new interchange at S.R. 9/I-95 and S.R. 606/Oslo Road and S.R. 606/Oslo Road improvements. Additionally, S.R. 606/Oslo Road will have capacity improvements to four lanes from west of S.R. 9/I-95 to 58th Avenue per Indian River County Resolution Nos. 2017-022 and 2017-023. Project improvements consist of constructing a new interchange with partial cloverleaf ramps at S.R. 9/I-95 and S.R. 606/Oslo Road, widening S.R. 606/Oslo Road from a two-lane to a four-lane divided roadway from west of S.R. 9/I-95 to SW 58th Avenue, installing interchange ramp lighting, replacing the existing S.R. 606/Oslo Road bridge over S.R. 9/I-95, installing a new signalized intersection at S.R. 606/Oslo Road and 66th Avenue SW, installing intersection lighting at 74th Avenue, 66th Avenue, and 58th Avenue, realigning 82nd Avenue at S.R. 606/Oslo Road, eliminating the 86th Avenue connection to S.R. 606/Oslo Road, constructing 13th Street SW to connect 86th Avenue SW and 90th Avenue, extending the south limit the existing noise wall on S.R. 9/I-95, replacing Indian River County sanitary, water and raw water mains, upgrading signing, signalization, intersection lighting, bicycle lanes, and sidewalks, installing a closed drainage system and constructing three drainage ponds.
