The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will conduct a public meeting regarding the above referenced project within Palm Beach County. This public meeting will be offered virtually and in-person. The virtual meeting will be held on **Wednesday, July 22, 2026** and the in-person meeting will be held on **Thursday, July 23, 2026**. The virtual meeting will begin at **6:00 p.m.** with a formal presentation followed by a question-and-answer session. The in-person meeting will begin at **6:00 p.m.** following an open-house format with project displays for viewing and staff available to answer questions. Questions and comments may be submitted prior to the meeting by contacting the FDOT Project Manager Greg Jett, P.E.

PURPOSE OF PROJECT: To improve traffic operations, safety, and mobility within the interchange and along the surrounding roadway network. The project is intended to reduce congestion and traffic spillback onto the I-95 mainline, improve merging movements, enhance roadway operations for motorists, and improve accessibility for pedestrians through Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) related upgrades.

PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

- Reconfigure the existing interchange ramps into a tight diamond interchange configuration.
- Add auxiliary lanes to improve traffic flow, operational efficiency, and safety.
- Repave the existing roadway to improve the resiliency of our infrastructure.
- Provide lighting enhancements.
- Provide drainage modifications, and landscape improvements within the existing median.
- Upgrade signing and pavement markings, existing curb ramps, crosswalks, and detectable warnings to improve pedestrian accessibility and meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) criteria.

CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS

- Work will be done in phases to reduce the effects of construction on the community.
- Temporary lane closures will be required during non-peak hours.
- Pedestrian traffic will be maintained at all times.
- Access to properties along the corridor will be maintained during construction.
- Another public meeting (Construction Open House) will be held prior to construction. Detailed information about how to keep informed of potential construction impacts will be provided at that meeting.

- Anticipated Construction Start: **Summer 2027**
- Anticipated Construction End: **Summer 2029**
- Estimated Construction Cost: **\$ 28.5 Million**
